The Court opened by proclamation

It is remembered that heretofore
To-wit: on the 11th day of November A.D.
1869.. the same being one of the days
of the October Special Term A.D.
1869 of The Court of Common
Pleas of The City of Aurora, the
following among other proceedings
were had and entered of record
in said Court To-wit:

This day
again came the Parties to this
suit by their attorneys and the
Court having heard the evidence
adduced finds the issues joined
for the Plaintiff and assesses
his damages to the sum of
Two hundred and Sixty Three
Dollars and Seventy Seven cents.

Therefore it is considered by
the Court that the Plaintiff have

and recover of the Defendant
his damages of Two hundred and
Sixty three Dollars and Seventy
Seven cents in form aforesaid assess-
ed and also his costs and charges
by him about this suit expended
and have execution therefor.

To which decision of the Court
the Defendant at the time excepted
and prayed an appeal in this cause
to the Supreme Court of the State of
Illinois. It is ordered by the Court
that the appeal be allowed upon
Defendant entering into Bonds
in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars
with Charles Blosson as surety
and that he have thirty days to
file his Bond and Bill of exceptions
in thirty days.

And afterwards Court on the 26th
day of November A D 1869. there was
filed in the Office of the Clerk of
said Court a certain Appeal Bond
which is in the words of figures follow-
ing To wit:


Know all men by these presents that

we Samuel J. Hance and Charles Stosson
are justly indebted to William H.
Snowden for the use of John Rankin
in the penal sum of five hundred
dollars lawful money. & the payment
of which well and truly to be made
we bind ourselves our heirs and
administrators and executors and
assigns jointly and severally and firmly
by these presents

Given under our hands and seals
this 25th day of November A D 1859

The
condition of the above obligation is
such whereas the said William
Snowden for the use of said John Rankin
in the Court of Common Pleas of the City
of Aurora at the October Special Term
thereof A D 1859 recovered against Samuel
J. Hance aforesaid a judgment for
the sum of two hundred and sixty three
7/100 (\$263 7/100) dollars damages besides
costs of suit from which judgment
the said Samuel J. Hance has prayed
an appeal to the Supreme Court of the
State of Illinois. Now therefore if the
said Samuel J. Hance shall duly
prosecute his said appeal and shall

pray the said Judgment, costs, interest
and damages in case the Judgment
shall be affirmed then this obligation
to become void otherwise to remain
in full force and effect
