Be it Remembered that on the 3^d day of
February A.D. 1853 - the same being one of the
days of the January Special Term of the said
Kane County Circuit Court A.D. 1853 - the
following among other proceedings were had
and entered of Record to wit:

v } Appeal
John J. Ladd } This day comes
on to be heard the defend-
ant's motion heretofore entered herein for a new

trial

after argument of counsel the Court being fully advised overrule said motion. It is therefore considered by the Court that the plaintiff have and recover of from the said defendant the sum of thirty two dollars and his costs in this behalf expended and that he have execution therefor, & which ruling of the Court the defendant by his counsel excepts and prays an Appeal to the Supreme Court which is allowed upon said defendant giving Bond in the penal sum of Two Hundred Dollars conditioned according to Law to be filed in thirty days with security to be approved by the Clerk of this Court.

And Afterwards to wit on the 3rd day of March A.D. 1853 - an Appeal Bond was filed in the Office of the Clerk of said Circuit Court in the words and figures following to wit:

Know all

Men by these Presents that We John S. Sade and John J. Randall are held and firmly bound unto Michael Ponsoby in the penal sum of two hundred dollars to be paid to the said Michael Ponsoby his heirs executors administrators and assigns & which payment well and truly to be made we bind ourselves our heirs, executors and administrators firmly by these presents Sealed with our Seals and dated this 6th day of March A.D. 1853.

The condition of the above Obligation is such that
whereas the above-bonded John S. Sadd has
this day taken an appeal to the Supreme
Court of this State from the judgment in the Kane
County Circuit Court in this State in favor of the
said Michael Forsonby and against the said
John S. Sadd for the sum of thirty two dollars
and costs of suit in which said suit Michael
Forsonby is plaintiff & John S. Sadd is defendant
Now in case the said Sadd shall duly prose-
cute his said appeal with effect and shall pay
said judgment costs interest and damages in
case said judgment shall be affirmed then
this obligation shall be void otherwise to remain in
full force and effect
