Jackson County Circuit Court Decr Septem 1860

At a Special Term of the Jackson County Circuit Court began and held in the Court House in the town of Murphyboro Jackson County State of Illinois on Monday December 3<sup>rd</sup> A.D. 1860

Present the Honorable Alexander H. Jeustine  
Judge of the Third Judicial Circuit, and Presiding  
Judge of the Jackson County Circuit Court,  
Anderson P. Conner States Attorney,  
James P. Watson Clerk and Abel C. Davis Sheriff

Whereupon the Following Order was made

{ Tuesday Decmon 8<sup>th</sup> 1860

And now on this day came the parties by their Attorneys, Whereupon the agreement of Parties this cause is to be tried on Tuesday Next.

Wednesday December 12<sup>th</sup> 1860

And now on this day again came the Plaintiff by his Attorneys Hogan & Allen and C. Thomas, and the defendants by their Attorneys Haynes & Parrish Whereupon Issue joined and cause submitted to a jury, and a jury of twelve good and lawful men being called, Hogan Wheeler, George Will, Martin

Martin Chidley, Andrew Reiman, William Hagler  
Josiah Phelps, Benjamin J Brown, George Butcher  
Joseph Whistler, John N Reynolds, John W Grobaugh  
and Henry Welch who after being sworn to try  
the Issue joined and a True Verdict Rendered, and  
after Hearing the Evidence and Argument of  
Counsel, Retired to Consider of their Verdict,  
and Returned into Open Court the Following  
Verdict "We the Jury find the defendants Guilty  
and Assess the Plaintiff's Damage at the Sum of  
Three hundred dollars." It is therefore

Ordered by the Court that the Plaintiff Benton  
Giv have Judgment for and against the said  
Defendants, the Illinois Central Rail Road Com-  
pany, for the Sum of Three hundred dollars, and  
do Recover of and from them the said Sum of  
Three Hundred dollars being the Amount of the  
Damages as Assessed together with the Costs of this  
suit herein to be taxed and may have Execution  
therefor. Whereupon Motion is made by Defendants  
Attorneys for a New trial, Motion for a New trial  
overruled by the Court. The defendant by their  
Attorneys prays an Appeal to the Supreme Court  
of the State of Illinois. Appeal Granted by  
Filing Bond within Thirty days from this date  
in the penal Sum of Five hundred dollars  
with J. V. Haynie as Security.

Bill of Exception Signed Sealed and Filed.

and afterwards to wit on the 25<sup>th</sup> day of November  
A.D 1860. the following Appeal Bond was filed  
which is in Words and Figures as follows. to wit:

Know all men by these presents that We the  
Illinois Central Railroad Company and Isham A.  
Hayne are held and firmly bound to Benton Gile  
in the sum of Five hundred dollars lawful  
money of the United States for the payment of  
which well and truly to be made we bind ourselves  
Our heirs executors and Administrators jointly sever-  
ally and firmly by these presents. Witness Our hands  
and Seal this 27<sup>th</sup> day of December A.D 1860.

The Condition of the above obligation is such  
that Whereas the said Benton Gile did on the  
12<sup>th</sup> day of December A.D 1860 before the Circuit  
Court of the County of Jackson and State of Illinois  
recover a judgment against the above bounden  
Illinois Central Rail Road Company for the sum  
of Three hundred dollars and costs of suit from  
which judgment the said Illinois Central Rail-  
road Company has taken an appeal to the Supreme  
Court of the State of Illinois; Now if the said  
Illinois Central Railroad Company Shall prosecute  
their Appeal duly and with effect, and Shall  
pay the judgment costs interest and damages  
in case the judgment aforesaid Shall be affirmed  
then the above Obligation to be void otherwise to  
be and remain in full force and effect
