Pleas before the Hon J. Wilson Denny
Judge of the Sixth Judicial District
of the state of Illinois at a term of
the circuit court begun and held at
the Court house within and for the
county of Rock Island and state of
Illinois on the second Monday
the ninth day of January A.D. 1860.

And afterwards went on the fourth day
of February 1860 and at the same term of
the court appeared the following
proceeding was had to wit.

" " } Assumpsit
Washington Wolf }

This day again came the
parties by their attorneys and the cause
coming on to be heard upon defendants
motion for a new trial and in arrest
of judgment; and the court having
heard the same and being sufficiently
advised in the premises overrules the
same. It is therefore ordered by the
court that plaintiff have and receive

of and from the defendant the sum of
Seven hundred and ninety Seven
Dollars and fifty cents together with
his costs and that he have execution
therefor. Thereupon defendant
prayed an appeal to the Supreme
Court which is granted on condition
that he enter into bond in the penal
sum of fifteen hundred dollars with
such security as may be approved by
the clerk of this court and file the said
bond in the clerk's office of this court
on or before the fifteenth day of March
next; and that he file his bill of
exceptions during the present month.

And afterwards went on the thirteenth day
of March 1865. the said defendant
filed in the clerk's office of the court
aforesaid his appeal bond which was
then and then approved by the clerk
of said court and is as follows to wit

Know all men by these presents
that we Washington Wolfe, Solomon
Wolfe, Thomas Marlatt of the County
of Mercer and State of Illinois
are held and firmly bound unto Wells
Wolcott of said County in the penal

Sum of Fifteen hundred dollars
for the payment of which well and
truly to be made we do by these presents
jointly and severally bind ourselves
our heirs executors and administrators
Sealed with our Seals and dated this
12th day of March 1860.

The condition of the above obligation
is such that whereas the said Washington
Wolfe has obtained an order for and
taken an appeal to the Supreme court
of the state aforesaid held at Ottawa and
in the third grand division ~~of the~~ of
an appeal upon a certain judgment
rendered in the circuit court within and
for the county of Rock Island in the state
aforesaid at the January term thereof A.D.
1860. in favor of said Wells Willets and
against the said Washington Wolfe for
the sum of Seven hundred and ninety
dollars and fifty cents damage and
costs of suit. Now if the said Washington
Wolfe shall pay the judgment costs
interest and damages in said suit in case
said judgment shall be affirmed and
shall also duly prosecute said appeal
then the above obligation shall be void
otherwise in full force
