Proceedings at a term of the Circuit Court begun and held at the Court House in the City of Peoria, in and for the County of Peoria in the State of Illinois on the second Monday of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty four, it being the eighth day of said month. Present the Honorable Curslow Peters, Judge of the sixteenth Judicial Circuit in the State of Illinois to wit,

This day came on to be heard the exceptions of the defendant to the Replevin Bond, filed on the 13<sup>th</sup> May 1854 on consideration whereof the court sustained said exceptions and on motion of the plaintiffs leave is given them to amend said replevin bond. Issues being joined, it is ordered by the court that a jury be empanelled to try said issues, whereupon came a jury of twelve good and lawful men to wit: Alpheus Richardson Cyrus Tucker, George Houston, Eldrick Smith, Matthew Brown, John B Turbett, Charles Jacobs, Lewis Flagler, Hiram M. Moffitt, Daniel Shirk, George Divelbiss, Cyrus H. Blue, who being duly chosen, tried and sworn well and truly to try the issues joined and a true verdict give according to evidence were adjourned to meet the court again to morrow morning.

Saturday May 20<sup>th</sup> A. D. 1854

This day came the parties by their respective attorneys and the jury empanelled in this cause on yesterday, and the evidence having been fully heard the jury aforesaid on their oaths aforesaid do say We the jury find the issues joined for the plaintiffs and they assess the damages of the plaintiffs by reason of the premises to the sum of one cent.

Monday May 22<sup>nd</sup> A. D. 1854

The Defendant by his attorney entered a motion for a new trial in this cause and the court being fully advised in the premises overruled said motion. Therefore it is considered that the plaintiffs

have and recover of the defendant one cent their damages by the jury assessed and also their costs by them about their suit in this behalf expended and that they have execution therefor. The defendant prayed an appeal in this cause to the Supreme Court of this State which is allowed him on his filing in the office of the clerk of this Court in thirty days an appeal bond payable to the plaintiffs in the penal sum of two hundred dollars with Alanson T. Page as surety and conditioned according to law.
