

This day came on to be heard, on a motion for a new trial, this cause; and the court being satisfied in the premises overruled said motion, whereupon the defendant by his attorney prayed the court for an appeal to the Supreme court of this state, which appeal is allowed on condition that the said defendant shall make his bond in the penal sum of two hundred dollars, with C. W. McClellan as security, said bond to be conditioned according to law, and filed with the clerk of this court in thirty days from this date. Bill of exceptions to be signed in vacation by agreement.

And afterwards to-wit- on the 15th day of June AD 1857, there was filed in the clerks office of the court aforesaid, an Appeal Bond, in words and figures following to-wit:-

"Know all men by these presents that we Lester Beach as principal and Charles W. McClellan as security are and are held and firmly bound unto Joseph Blanchard in the penal sum of two hundred dollars for the payment of which well and truly to be made we bind ourselves and our heirs by these presents jointly & severally & firmly.

Now the condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the circuit court in & for the county of Peoria & State of Illinois at the present May term thereof, rendered a judgment against the said Beach in favor of the said Blanchard in an action therein pending upon a writ of certiorari to review the proceedings of a justice of the peace in & for said county; which said judgment was for the sum of seventy one dollars and fifty-nine cents, from which said judg-

ment the said Beach took an appeal to the Supreme court of said state next to be held at Ottawa. Now if the said Beach shall prosecute his said appeal promptly, and shall pay whatever judgment may be rendered against him including damages interest & costs in case the said judgment shall be affirmed then this obligation to be void otherwise in force.
