Signed with our hand and sealed with our seals, dated at Newton this 29th day of June 1840.

The condition of the above bond is such that if the above bound Henry Van derhoof shall perform all the duties required to be performed by him as Collector of the said County of Jasper in the time and manner prescribed by law and when he shall be succeeded in office shall surrender and deliver over to his successor in office all books, papers & moneys belonging to the said County or State and appertaining to his said office then the above bond to be void, otherwise to remain in full force.

William L. G. Esq. Auditor
of Public Accounts of the State of Illinois complains of
Henry Vandenberg William Judges Richard Vandenberg and
James M. Burford defendants in this suit of a plea that they
under unto the said plaintiff the sum of eight hundred
dollars which to him they owe & from him unjustly detain

That whereas heretofore to wit: on the
twenty ninth day of ~~September~~ June in the year A.D. 1840 at the
County of Jasper in the state aforesaid the said debt: by their
certain writing obligatory by them duly executed & delivered in
pursuance of law signed by them and sealed with their seals
& now here to the Court shown the date whereof is the day
and year first above written acknowledged themselves to be
held and firmly bound to the people of the State of Illinois in
the Penal sum of Eight hundred dollars for the payment of
which well & truly to be made they said each of themselves their heirs
executors & administrators, which said writing obligatory was & is
subject to a certain condition therein expressed to wit that
if the above bounden ^{Henry Vandenberg} ~~Henry Vandenberg~~ should perform all
the duties required to be performed by him as collector
of the County of Jasper in the time & manner prescribed
by law & when he should be succeeded in office should surrender
& deliver over to his successor in office all books papers and
monies belonging to the said County or to the State and
appertaining to his said office then said writing obligatory
should become void otherwise to remain in full force which
said bond was duly executed & delivered by said debtors as the
official bond of the said Henry Vandenberg as collector of said
County of Jasper and plffs say that from the date of the
said writing obligatory until & after the first Monday
of March A.D. 1841 the said Henry Vandenberg was
& continued to be collector of the Revenue in & for the
said County of Jasper in the State aforesaid, and plffs now

hereover that during the time aforesaid said ^{Henry} Vanderhoff
did not perform all the duties required by law to be performed
by him as such collector in the time & manner prescribed
by law But that on the first Monday of March in the Year
A.D. 1841 at said County of Slope the said Henry Vanderhoff
by virtue of his said office did receive into his possession the
sum of Eighty-eight dollars & eight cents of the Revenue
of the said State for the Year A.D. 1840 which said
sum of money he the said Henry Vanderhoff hath ever
since failed to pay over to the Treasurer of the said State
as by law it was his duty to do on or before the said
first Monday of March A.D. 1841. by reason of which
failure to make such payment as by law required damages
at the rate of ten per centum per month from the said
first Monday of March hath accrued to said Plff of &
from said debts upon the said sum of money so by the
said Collector received & unpaid as aforesaid. And so by reason
of all the aforesaid premises an action hath accrued
to said Plff to demand & have of & from said debts
the said sum of eight hundred dollars the debt above
demanded which to pay, defts have ever & still do refuse
to pay & damages two hundred dollars & therefor this Suit
