defendant it is said manifest error hath intervened to the injury

of the aforesaid Leggett as we are informed by his complaint, and we being willing that error (if any there be) should be corrected in due form and manner, and that justice be done to the parties aforesaid, command you that if judgment thereof be given, you distinctly and openly without delay, send to our Justices of our Supreme Court the record and proceedings of the plaint aforesaid, with all things touching the same, under your seal, so that we may have the same before our Justices aforesaid at ^{Springfield} ~~Vandalia~~ in the county of ~~Wagon~~ ^{Wagon}

next, that the record and proceedings, being inspected, we may cause to be done therein, to correct the error, what of right ought to be done according to law.

Witness, the Hon. William Wilson, Chief Justice of our said Court, and the seal thereof at ^{Springfield} ~~Vandalia~~, this 21st day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine

BECAUSE in the record and proceedings, and also in the rendition of the judgment, of plea which was in the Circuit Court of *Morgan* County, before the Judge thereof, between *Charles Chrisman* Plaintiff and *John Leggett* who was impleaded with *Francis A Vanburn* and *James Tucker*

field defendant it is said that manifest error hath intervened to the injury of the said *Leggett* as we are informed by *his* complaint, the record and proceedings of which said judgment, we have caused to be brought into our Supreme Court of the State of Illinois, at *Vernon Spring* *field* *dale*, before the Judges thereof, to correct the errors in the same, in due form and manner, according to law; therefore we command you, that by good and lawful men of your county, you give notice to the said *Charles Chrisman*

that *he* be and appear before the Judges of our said Supreme Court, at the next term of said Court, to be holden at *Springfield* *Vandalia*, in said State, on the *27th* Monday in *December* next, to hear the records and proceedings aforesaid, and the errors assigned, if *he* shall think fit; and further to *do* and receive what the said Court shall order in this behalf; and have you then there the names of those by whom you shall give the said *Charles Chrisman* notice, together with this writ.

Witness, the Hon. William Wilson, Chief Justice of our said Court, and the seal thereof, at *Springfield* *Vandalia*, this *26th* day of *November* in the year of our Lord, 1837.
