And this deponent further says that Charles O. Sheppard, Jonathan R. Salisbury, Robert L. Stevens, Joel S. Smith, Taylor G. Goodwell, Rufus S. Witcher, Solva Brintnall & Henson Wilson are jointly indebted to the Bank of Auburn aforesaid in the sum of ten thousand nine hundred and eighty eight dollars & seventy four cents on a judgment recovered and rendered in favor of the Bank of Auburn aforesaid against the said Charles O. Sheppard, Jonathan R. Salisbury, Robert L. Stevens, Joel S. Smith, Taylor G. Goodwell, Rufus S. Witcher, Solva Brintnall & Henson Wilson, as defendants, in the supreme Court of the State of New York & entered in the county of Wyoming in said State of New York on the eighteenth day of November in the year of Our Lord 1854 for the sum of Ten thousand five hundred & twelve dollars & forty eight cents being the amount of recovery

& costs in an action of assumpsit & on contract, brought by said Bank of Auburn against said Charles C. Shepard, Jonathan R. Salisbury, Robert L. Stevens, Joel S. Smith, Taylor G. Goodwill, Rufus L. Whiteaker, Sobra Brintnall & Herman Wilson, and also for and in the sum of four hundred and fifty eight dollars & twenty six cents costs for interest accrued and now due and unpaid upon said judgment, making in all the said sum of ten thousand nine hundred and eighty eight dollars & seventy four cents first above mentioned -

And deponent further saith that the said judgment still remains in full force & effect - not reversed, paid, satisfied or otherwise vacated - and the said Bank of Auburn aforesaid hath not obtained any execution or satisfaction of or upon said judgment so recovered as aforesaid -

And this deponent further saith that the debt aforesaid will be in danger of being lost, and that the benefit of whatever judgment may be obtained therefor ~~will~~ in an action which the Bank of Auburn aforesaid are about to commence in the said circuit court of Cook county Illinois against the said Charles C. And with respect to the said above named Jonathan R. Salisbury this deponent further says & charges that he has heard the aforesaid Salisbury examined on oath recently before H. L. Rucker Esq. of the city of Chicago, touching and concerning the facts & circumstances hereinafter stated and referred to, and from which, as well as from various other sources of information corroborative thereto this deponent has ascertained that in the month of December A.D. 1853 said Salisbury was owner of a large amount of real & personal property in the state of New York, consisting of farms & farm stock, & implements - Houses, lands, stores, Ashery, and other real estate and also was a partner in two stores in said State of New York, one at Franklinville Cattaraugus county where & in which he was a partner with one Lyon - another at Machias where & in which he was a partner with one Tier, & at which stores severally said Salisbury had and owned a large amount of goods, wares & Merchandise & other personal property including a large amount of notes, accounts and other debts due to said Salisbury and his

other partners at said several stores respectively - that during said month of December 1853 or about that time said Salisbury made two fraudulent assignments of large amounts of real and personal property to his two several partners aforesaid respectively - thereby assigning to said several partners amounts of property and value therein exceeding by the sum of from fifteen to twenty thousand dollars the amount of consideration paid or to be paid by said several partners; the assignees, respectively, as aforesaid - and thereby fraudulently intending to place the same out of the reach of his creditors & to hinder, delay & defraud his creditors, or some one or more of them in the collection of their just debts against him & with a view to his (said Salisbury's) future benefit - and also that the said Salisbury, not far from the same time last specified, or in the winter or spring of A.D. 1854 sold and conveyed to Messrs Conover & Saraght of the city of New York or one of them, a valuable farm which he owned in the state of New York, for about one thousand dollars in cash or its equivalent and a certain further amount of R. Road or Canal stock in the State of Pennsylvania or elsewhere of inconsiderable value - which farm was worth two thousand four hundred dollars - & the sale and conveyance of which was for a grossly inadequate

price & was intended by said Salisbury fraudulently to place said property beyond the reach of his creditors, or of some one or more of them, and to hinder, delay & defraud said last named creditors in the collection of their just debts against him, & for his future benefit as aforesaid. And also that said Salisbury about the same period in the said State of New York sold and transferred to one Benjamin Howard a large amount of notes & accounts owned by him against divers persons in said State of New York & amounting to about four thousand dollars, which sale & transfer was for the sum of one thousand dollars payable on time by said Howard's note, & which said assigned notes & accounts were worth a much larger sum than said thousand dollars & which sale was in fraud & bad faith towards the creditors of said Salisbury & intended to hinder & delay & defraud them or some one or more of them in the collection of their just debts against him, and done for his, said Salisbury's future benefit - and further this deponent saith not -
