There appears to be a Rule of the S. C. Entered against James Carter late Sheriff of Edwards County, in favor or on motion of James M. Durcan late Ckr. S. C. for not returning the fee Bill in the case of ^{Wm} Pickering vs Daird Orange - (July, 1839) and ~~10-00~~ the fee Bill has not been returned. but enclosed you will find the fee Bill in the case of ^{Wm} Pickering vs Daniel Orange - (Daird Orange not known in the case) - the money however has long since been remitted as I believe - Please have the goodness on receipt of this to examine the filed letters relating to the Office also the date of fee Bill on Execution Docket as the fee bill was of the same nature as an Ex. - also the Judge Docket, and see what return if any there be - the reason of the fee bill not being returned was that the Deft. Daniel Orange thought he had a claim to same after the payment thereof - however if after examination of all the vouchers on file in your Office you cannot be satisfied that the above amt. has not been paid. you can issue the Rule of Court inserting (Daniel) instead of (Daird), and the money shall be paid or otherwise the money will be paid immediately you inform me that - ~~that~~ the same has not hitherto been paid - answer this soon as Carter does not wish any trouble in the case
