

Be it remembered that heretofore to-wit: at the February Term of said Court to-wit: on the 14th day of March, the following among other proceedings, were had and entered of Record, to-wit:

This day comes the said plaintiff by Vos and Spencer his attorneys, and the said defendant by A. W. Erwin his attorney, also comes, and by agreement of said parties now given in open Court, the trial of the matter at issue herein between the said parties, is submitted to the Court without the intervention of a jury, and the Court after hearing the evidence as well on the part of the said plaintiff as of the said defendant, the arguments of counsel, and being fully advised in the premises, now finds the

issues for the plaintiff, and assesses his damages
to the sum of Eleven dollars.

Therefore it is considered that the
said plaintiff do have and recover of the said
defendant his damage of Eleven dollars, in form
as aforesaid by the court assessed, together with
his Costs and Charges, by him about his suit on this
behalf Expended and Law Execution thereon,

Whereupon the said defendant
by his Counsel Excepts, and prays an appeal to
the Supreme Court of the State of Illinois, which is
granted by the court on condition, that the said
defendant shall within three weeks from this
date, Execute and file with the clerk of this court
his Appeal Bond herein in the penal sum of Three
hundred and fifty dollars, conditioned according to
law, with J. B. Long Surety Agents,

And of Records, to-wit: on the
Twenty second day of March, in the year last
aforesaid, there was filed in the court aforesaid a
certain appeal Bond, which is in the words and
figures following, to-wit:

It now all men by these
presents, that we Leonard Falch and John Sang
are indebted to Charles Stark, in the penal sum
of Three hundred and fifty dollars lawful money
for the payment of which, well and truly to be made
we bind ourselves on this Execution and administration

jointly & severally firmly by the presents. Witness our
hands and seals this twenty first day of March
A D 1859

The condition of this obligation is such
that whereas the above named Charles Starr did
on the seven tenth day of March A D 1859 in the
Circuit Court of the County of Lincoln, Missouri
recover a judgment
against the above bounden Leonard Falch for the
sum of Eleven dollars besides costs of suit, from which
the said Leonard Falch has taken an appeal to the
Supreme Court. Now therefore if the said Leonard
Falch shall duly prosecute this said appeal, and
pay the judgment costs and interest & damages in
case said judgment shall be affirmed by the
Supreme Court, then this obligation to be void other-
wise to remain in full force and virtue
