Be it Remembered, that afterwards,
to-wit: on the 8th day of March, A.D. 1860,
the same being one of the days of the
February Term of said Court, 1860, the
following proceedings, among others, were
had and entered of record in said Court,
to-wit:—

Patrick Mann. }

This day comes the Com-
plainant by Joslyn & Wells her Solicitors,
and the defendant by Clifford his Solicitor,
also comes, and the defendant's motion to
dissolve the Injunction herein, coming on to
be heard, after argument of counsel, the
Court being fully advised, sustains said
motions, and orders the Injunction dissolved.
Whereupon the defendant by his Solicitor,
aforesaid, files his Demurer to Complainant's
Bill, in which the Complainant joins. The
Court being fully advised sustains said
Demurer, to which decision of the Court,
the Complainant by her counsel excepts,
and thereupon it is ordered by the Court
that the Complainant's Bill be dismissed ^{and}
that the defendant have & recover of the

Complainant his costs in this suit expended, and have execution therefor. Whereupon the Complainant prays an Appeal to the Supreme Court, of the State of Illinois, - which is allowed by the Court upon condition that she file her Appeal bond with the Clerk of this Court, in ten days, in the penal sum of two hundred dollars, conditioned according to law; with E. S. Joslyn, and C. B. Wells, as sureties.

And afterwards, to wit, on the 18th day of March, A.D. 1860, an Appeal Bond was filed in the Clerk's Office aforesaid, which is in the words and figures following, to wit: -

Know all men by these presents, that we, Mary Gleason, Dennis Gleason, E. S. Joslyn, & Charles B. Wells, are held and firmly bound unto Patrick Mann, in the penal sum of Two Hundred dollars, for the payment of which sum well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors, and administrators, jointly, severally and firmly by these presents. Witness our hands and seals this 18th day of March, A.D. 1860.
