April AD 1859 being at the aforesaid March
Term of said Court the following order was
entered upon the records of our said Court
which is as follows To Wit;

This day came
the Defendants by their Attorney and the
said Plaintiff by his attorney. And this came
coming on for a hearing on the defendants
motion to dissolve the Injunction herein.
And after hearing the same it is ordered by
the Court that the motion be allowed. And
the Injunction dissolved and Bill dismissed.
Therefore it is considered by the Court that
the said defendants have and recover of
and from the said Plaintiff their costs
by them in this suit laid out and expended
and may have execution therefor. Therefore
came the said Plaintiff and prays an appeal
to the Supreme Court, which is allowed by
the Court upon the said Plaintiff rectifying
into bond in the sum of Five hundred
dollars with Harry Hardin as Security
Bond and Bill of Receptions to be filed in
Ten days

Know all men by These Presents, That we
Chancy Hardin & Harry Hardin are held
and firmly bound unto Joseph Weaver &
Samuel A. Patterson in the Penal sum of

Five Hundred Dollars for the payment of
which well and truly to be made we bind
ourselves our heirs executors and adminis-
trators jointly severally and firmly by
these presents, Witness our Hands and
Seals This 18th day of April Anno Domini
One Thousand eight Hundred and fifty nine
The Condition of the above obligation
is such that Whereas the said Joseph
Wear & Samuel H Patterson did on the
15 day of April 1859 in the Circuit Court
within and for the County of Warren and
State of Illinois recover a Judgment against
the above bounden Chauncy for the Dissol-
ution of a certain injunction and costs
of suit, from which Judgment of said
Circuit Court the said Chauncy Hardin
has prayed for and obtained an appeal
to the Supreme Court of said State, Now if
the said Chauncy Hardin shall duly
prosecute his said appeal with effect
and shall moreover pay the amount of
the Judgment Costs Interest and damages
rendered and to be rendered against him
in case the said Judgment shall be affirmed
in the said Supreme Court then the above
obligation to be null and void, otherwise
to remain in full force and virtue,
