Know all men by these presents, that we, John A. Peice, Francis C. Moore, and Daniel G. Whitney, are held and firmly bound unto Luther Edgerton, in the sum of Three Hundred Dollars lawful money, for the payment of which well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our heirs be this twelfth day of February A.D. 1841.

The condition of this obligation is such, that, whereas the above bound John A. Peice is about to sue out of the Supreme Court of the State of Illinois a writ of error with supersedeas, for the reversal of a judgment, obtained by said Luther Edgerton against the said John A. Peice in the Adams County Circuit Court, at the January Term thereof, A.D. 1841, for the sum of One Hundred and Thirteen Dollars _____, in a certain action of assumpsit: Now if the said John A. Peice shall well and truly prosecute the said writ of error to successful issue, or shall pay the costs and condemnation of the said supreme court, in the premises — then this obligation to be void — else to remain in full force and virtue in law.
