Jackson County Circuit Court Spl Dec term 1860

At a Special Term of the Jackson County Circuit Court begun and held in the Court House in the Town of Mansfield Jackson County State of Illinois on Monday December 3rd 1860.

Present the Honorable Alexander M Jackson Judge of the 3rd Judicial Circuit, and Presiding Judge of the Jackson County Circuit Court.
Anderson P Conner States Attorney, James P Watson Clerk and Abel Davis Sheriff.

And now on this day the following Order was made

And now on this day came the Plaintiff by his Attorney C. S. Ward and the defendants being three times solemnly called came not but made default. It is therefore considered and ordered by the Court that the Plaintiff George Martin have judgment by default against the said defendants William A Davis and Stephen D Hall for his damages therein. And it appearing to the Court that this Suit is brought upon an Instrument of Writing for the payment of money only and that the damages of said Plaintiff in this case rest in computation, It is therefore ordered by the Court that the Clerk Appr. Compute and Report the said Damages, Whereupon the Clerk proceeds to Compute and Appr the damages and Reports to the Court the Sum of twelve hundred and eighteen dollars and twenty four Cents, the Amount of the Plaintiff Damages, whose Report of the Appraisal and Computation, upon Examination by the Court is approved and allowed. It is therefore,

Ordered and adjudged by the Court that the said Plaintiff George Martin have judgment and do Recover of the said Defendants William H Davis & Stephen S Hall the said Sum of Twelve hundred and Eighteen dollars and twenty four Cents being the Amount of the damages assessed and Computed as aforesaid together with the Costs and Charges herein expended, and that he may have execution therefor.

Whereupon the Defendants pray an Appeal to the Supreme Court of the State of Illinois, Appeal Granted, Bond to be filed within Twenty days from this date the 20th day of December 1860, in the penal Sum of sixteen hundred dollars with Benjamin S Hall as Security.

And afterwards to wit on the 29th day of December 1860 the following Appeal ^{and} was filed which is in words and figures as follows to wit.

Know all men by these presents that We William H Davis, Stephen S Hall and Benjamin S Hall are held and firmly bound unto George Martin in the penal Sum of Sixteen hundred dollars lawful money of the United States for the payment of where well and truly to be made we bind ourselves our heirs executors and administrators jointly, jointly, jointly and severally by these presents. Witness our hands and Seals this 29th day of December AD 1860.

The Condition of the above obligation is Such that Where as the said George Martin did on the 20th day of December AD 1860 before the Circuit Court in and for the County of Jackson and State of Illinois recover a judgment against the above bounden William H Davis and Stephen S Hall for the Sum of Twelve hundred and Eighteen dollars and twenty four Cents and Costs of suit from whose judgment the said William H Davis and Stephen S Hall have taken an Appeal to the Supreme Court of the State

of Illinois. Now of the said William H Davis and Stephen
S Hall shall prosecute their Appeal with effect and with-
out delay and shall pay the judgment Costs interests
and Damages in Case the judgment aforesaid shall be
affirmed then the above obligation to be void Otherwise
to remain in full force and virtue
