Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Jacob Rutledge  
and Jacob Wing

are held and firmly bound unto Jepttha Palmer

in the penal sum of one hundred and seventy five dollars  
for the payment of which, well and truly to

be made, we bind ourselves our heirs, executors, jointly, severally, and firmly by these  
presents: Witness our hands and seals, this 24<sup>th</sup> day of  
August A. D. 1840.

The condition of the above obligation is such, that whereas the said  
Jepttha Palmer

did, on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of May 1840,  
in the Circuit Court, within and for the County of Scott, and State of  
Illinois, recover a judgment against the above bounden Jacob Rutledge  
for the sum of one  
hundred dollars

and costs of suit, from which judgment of said Circuit Court, the said Jacob  
Rutledge

<sup>a writ of Error and Supersedeas</sup>  
has prayed for and obtained ~~as aforesaid~~ to the Supreme Court of said State.

Now if the said Jacob Rutledge

shall duly prosecute the said

Writ of Error ~~said appeal~~ with effect, and shall moreover pay the amount  
of the judgment, costs, interest, and damages, rendered and to be rendered against  
him in case the said judgment shall be affirmed in the said  
Supreme Court, then the above obligation to be null and void, otherwise to remain in  
full force and virtue.
