This day came the parties by their respective
attorneys and it is ordered by the Court that a Jury be em-
pannelled to try the issues in this cause, whereupon came a
jury of twelve good and lawful men to wit, Zenas Hotchkiss
Benjamin F. Smith, John Ramsey, George Divelbiss, Peter
Guthrie, John E. Titus, Joseph W. Gallaher, Sampson Shockey
Matthew Brown, Henry W. Flagler, John L. Stephens and
Thomas Johnson who being duly chosen tried and sworn,
well and truly to try the issues in this cause and a true
verdict give according to evidence on their oaths do say we
of the jury do find the issues for the plaintiff and do assess
his damages at the sum of seventy four dollars and ninety
cents, Therefore it is considered that the plaintiff have
and recover of the said James Jackson the sum of seventy
four dollars and ninety cents his damages aforesaid by the
jury assessed, together with his costs and charges by him
about his suit in this behalf expended and that he have
execution therefor.

Wednesday March 22nd 1854

This day came the defendant by Purple & Langer his attor-
neys and entered a motion for a new trial in this cause, and
the Court being fully advised in the premises overruled

said motion, Whereupon the defendant prayed an appeal to
the Supreme Court of this State, which is allowed upon his filing
bond in the office of the clerk of this Court with John Elting
as surety payable to the plaintiff in the penal sum of two
hundred dollars and conditioned ^{according} to law, which is done.
