Now at this day came
Mr. Campbell ~ on to be heard the motion
heretofore filed by Defendants Haines, Newhall &
Campbell ~~et al~~, by their attorney for a new
trial herein, which motion after argument by
counsel is overruled by the Court, to which the
said Defendants by their attorney except. It is
thereupon considered by the Court that the plain-
-tiff have and recover of the Defendants Andrew
M. Haines, Horatio Newhall, George Ferguson and
George W. Campbell, the debt so as aforesaid found
by the Court: to wit: the sum of Eight Hundred &
Eighty Dollars, together with his costs herein expended
and that he have execution therefor, said Execution
to be returned by the Sheriff as satisfied upon the
payment of the costs herein together with the sum of

Four hundred & eighty five Dollars and Seventy Six cents
That being the amount heretofore assessed by the
Court as the Plaintiffs damages" herein.

And afterwards,
to-wit: on the 30th day of August 1859, as yet of the
August Term 1859 in the Records of the proceedings of
the said Court in the above entitled cause, appears
the following entry. to-wit:



By McCallan their Attorney and pray an appeal
to the Supreme Court, which is granted, conditioned
that they enter into, and file with the Clerk of this
Court within sixty days from this date a good and
sufficient appeal bond, properly conditioned with
either Charles R Beuret or Ralph S. Morris as
surety, and they file bill of exceptions, which is
certified by the Court.

And afterwards, bonds, on the 29th day
of October 1859, the said Defendants, filed their appeal
bonds in said cause which is in the words & figures
following: to-wit:

Know all men by these presents that Wm. Andrew
M. Harris, Horatio Newhall, George W. Campbell
and Charles R. Bennett are hereunto firmly
bound unto John Thompson, in the sum of One =
thousand Dollars lawful money of the United
States, payment of which well and truly to be paid
we bind ourselves, our heirs, Executors and Administrators
jointly and severally, firmly by these presents.

The condition of the above obligation is such
that whereas the said John Thompson did at the aforesaid
Term & d^y 1859 of the said County Circuit Court receive
a judgement against the said Harris Newhall
and Campbell for the sum of Four Hundred &
Eighty five & 1/100 Dollars, from which judgement
they have taken an appeal to the Supreme Court of
the State of Illinois: Now if the said obligors shall
pay the judgement, costs, interest and damages in case
said judgement be affirmed by the said Supreme Court
and shall duly prosecute their said appeal then the
obligation to be void otherwise to remain in full force
& effect: Witness our hands and seals this 28th
day of October A.D. 1859.
