Sets forth that James II. Majors was sworn by plaintiff and testified in substance as follows:

I was acquainted with James M. Robinson in his life time. He resided at Attica, Indiana. He died there a year ago last February. The defendant is brother-in-law to James M. Robinson. The father's name is William D. Robinson. After the father's death there was a partition of his property. After the partition was made, Cast, the defendant, told me that he had sold Robinson some land; couldn't state the amount. It was to be I think twenty dollars an acre. I was at Mr. Cast's house afterwards, and he told me that he had taken a plow and four or five yoke of cattle on the land. The plow referred to was a breaking plow, and stood near the house. Cast told me that the team was counted in at four hundred and seventy-five dollars in the trade.—Cast told me that he had taken the cattle a short time before he moved to Attica.

Jackson Marlow, another witness for plaintiff called and sworn, stated that he resides in the town of Attica. Was acquainted with James M. Robinson, and he resided at Cast's house, in the summer and fall of 1858, and part of the winter of 1859. That he sold Cast's wife a house and lot in the town of Attica, in 1856. In 1858 he took Cast

for paymaster, and took a note from him for three hundred and twentyfive dollars, which had been given to him by Robinson. There were two other notes on the same piece of paper, from which he tore the one he gave to witness, and of like amounts. At Robinson's death he didn't know where all his papers were, but judged they were in Cast's hands. Cast stated in a conversation at witness' house, that there was an article of agreement between them. In that agreement the lund was to be twenty-five dollars an acre—there was supposed to be 440 acres altogether, of which, in the partition among the heirs, Cast had 80 or 90 acres when the notes were given, and for which the notes were given. Knew the notes were given for real estate, from the fact that they were described in the article of agreement. The real estate fell short some \$500-and some of those notes were to be refunded, and some four or five hundred dollars of them were refunded. Saw some other papers, in Robinson's possession. In the latter part of 1858, saw him have a note signed by Seely Hetfield, for about \$1400. Also, several receipts from Cast and his wife. Don't know what became of the Hetfield note, nor of the receipts. There were fifteen or twenty in all, amounting to \$2000 or \$2500. Cast told me he had about a hundred dollars to apply on a note I held against the estate. He never paid anything on it. Robinson went to Attica to Cast's in June, 1858. He staid there till his death. Was to pay two dollars a week for board. Don't know whether it was ever paid or not. Saw the agreement six weeks or two months before Robinson died. The other two notes which I said were torn off from mine, I don't know what became of them. This note transaction occurred in October, '57. Cast was then in Attica, and I lived there .-Cast had taken to Attica three yoke of oxen, that he traded to me, that he said he had got on his wife's interest in the land.

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Defendant then moved to exclude Marlow's testimony from the jury, on the ground of his interest, and because the testimony was irrelevant under the pleadings.

Motion overruled and defendant excepted.

DEFENDANT'S TESTIMONY.

Deposition of Ruth Alexander. Sets forth that witness, about a month and a half before James M. Robinson died, had a conversation with him at Attica, in which Robinson stated that he was owing Aquilla (meaning Cast), considerable, but said he was not prepared to pay it now, as he had got behind. He named over several who had ill treated him, and worked him out of his property.

Knew of Cast getting two yoke of cattle of Robinson when they

lived together on Spring Creek, three years ago. Robinson left his plow there when he went to Indiana, and it is now undisposed of.

Ephraim S. Cast, sworn on the part of defendant, testified that James Robinson died, he thought, a year ago last February. He was there in Attica several days. They both told me that they had had a settlement, and that Mr. Robinson had not given a receipt, and Cast asked him for a receipt then, and they passed receipts in my presence.

They were both square they said then. My brother, Aquilla Cast, took two yoke of cattle to Attica. Both told witness that Cast had got three or four yoke from Robinson. Don't know whether any was ever returned. Both Cast and Robinson told me that they had had a settlement. Cast wrote out a receipt, and Robinson signed it.

Isaac Cast, sworn and testified that Aquilla Cast got two or three yoke of cattle and brought them to Alexander's place. He got them on a trade, of my brother's wife's share of some land up the Creek.

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Mr. Majors recalled, and testified that he had seen Robinson write, and that a note presented to him favored his hand writing, and looked like it. Which note was assigned to Aquilla Cast by James M. Robinson, for value received, November 7th, 1858, and put in evidence as tending to show a settlement up to that time. Cast also filed and read an affidavit showing the loss of the receipt from Robinson to him—which was all the evidence in the case.

The court gave them this instruction for the defendant. The making or assignment of a promissory note imports in law a value received for it by the maker or assignor. And if the Jury believe that Robinson executed certain promissory notes to Cast, or that he assigned notes made by other parties to Cast, the burden of proof is on the plaintiff to show that Robinson received no value for the making or assignment of said notes. The plaintiff cannot recover in this action the amount of any notes Robinson may have executed to Cast. And the Court, of its own motion, added "which have not been paid." To which the defendant excepted, as nullifying the previous part of the instructions.

The defendant also asked the following instruction:

If the plaintiff claims money or property in the hands of the defendant, belonging to Robinson at the time of his decease, he must first make and prove a demand for the money and property thus in the hands of the defendant, and the plaintiff's remedy in such case, would be in another form of action.

The Court refused to give the same, and the defendant excepted.

POINTS FOR PLAINTIFF IN ERROR.

1st. The Court erred in refusing to exclude the testimony of Jackson Marlow.

Indebitatus assumpsit lies on an executed contract, but not on an executory one.

The Plaintiff has declared, as on an executed contract. Marlow's testimony only goes to show an executory one.

The evidence must correspond with the allegations and be confined to the point at issue. 1 Greenleaf's Ev., sec. 50. The testimony of Marlow does neither.

2d. The Court erred in overruling the motion for a new trial.

The evidence makes out a case of a sale of land, on the part of Cast, and a sale of notes and stock, on the part of Robinson, in payment for the same. Fairly construed, it shows nothing else; while the case made by the pleadings shows that the defendant had from Robinson these notes, stock, &c., under an express or an implied contract to pay for them, without having already done so—thus clearly violating the principle, that the allegata and probata must agree.

"It is a rule in pleading, subject to no exception, that a party must recover, if at all, on, and according to, the case he has made for himself in his declaration. He is not permitted to make one case by his allegations, and recover on a different case made by the proof."

Judge Breese, in Moss vs. Johnson, 22 Illinois, 640.

If the evidence in the case shows anything, it is, that land was sold by one party, and paid for by the other in stock and notes. To say now, that the administrator under the common counts can recover by this evidence for those notes and stock, seems too preposterous for argument.

- 3d. Upon the instructions given by the Court, the verdict should have been for the defendant.
 - 4th. The Court erred in modifying defendant's first instruction.

By it, the Court instructs the jury in effect, that the plaintiff in this action can recover the amount of any notes Robinson may have executed to Cast, which have been paid; which modification not only neutralizes the preceding part of the instruction, but, to a common mind, conveys the idea, that, if a man pays a note, which he may have executed in his life time, his administrator after his death can turn round and collect the amount paid, from the payee—an idea not only absurd, but unheard of in the law.

5th. The Court erred in refusing defendant's last instruction.

The evidence shows, that Robinson was living, and died at Cast's house. Whatever effects, therefore, Robinson left, were lawfully in the possession of Cast, and he is not to be held liable in a suit at law, until some lawful authority appears to claim them.

For these reasons, the judgment should be reversed.
