Be it remembered that heretofore, to wit, on the fourteenth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty there was filed in the office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Peoria County in the State of Illinois a complaint - warrant, accompanied with a transcript of proceedings before the Mayor of the City of Peoria and appeal bond, which are in the words & figures following, to wit:

Complaint - I John C. Steyl City Marshal do complain of G. St. Beesman for keeping his grocery open on Sunday & selling liquor contrary to an ordinance of the City of Peoria.

Steyl, City Marshal that George St. Beesman has violated an ordinance of said City in relation to licensed in the City of Peoria Aforesaid These are therefore to command you forth with to apprehend the said George St. Beesman and bring him before me to answer the complaint and further to be dealt with according to law. This action is commenced on the com-  
plaint filed by the City Marshall  
J. C. Doyle charging defendant with having kept open  
his grocery on Sunday contrary to an ordinance of said City whereupon a warrant & 2 Subpeones was  
issued to Doyle Marshall - 27<sup>th</sup> Warrant and 2  
Subpeones returned served with defendant  
Docket 122 in Court by Doyle Marshall and the suit  
Begun 25 was continued by consent of parties to the 30<sup>th</sup>  
Court at 1 o'clock P.M. 30 parties  
Keyle 1.52 Appeared & a Subpeona & venire issued to  
Contin 121 Heath Marshall which was returned served  
Salf 25 by Doyle Marshall, with the following persons  
Venire 25 as jurors to wit: J. McLeggan, J. Hudson,  
Keyle 1.05 J. M. Lands, J. Mc. Law, W. Hoadley  
Swanson 25 & C. Remann who were sworn & the exam-  
ination was had & submitted & the jury  
4 oaths 25 after deliberation the jury returned stating  
Jury 25 that they could not agree & were discharged.  
Appeal 25 Defendant then proposed to submit the case to the  
Bond 50 decision of the Court and abide his judgment  
Transcript 25 & the Court having heard the testimony, adjudged  
\$5.82 defendant to be guilty of the charge alleged  
in the complaint & gave a judgment against  
defendant for fine \$25 & costs & entered up the sum  
of \$5.82

Fine \$25.00  
Costs 4.82

And as required by ordinance declared said defendant's  
license void.

April 1<sup>st</sup> defendant took an appeal & filed his bond with  
McRork as his security.

I hereby certify that the above is a true transcript of a judgment & the proceedings had thereon as appears of record on my docket & that the papers accompanying this transcript are all that came to my hand relating to said suit. Appeal Bond. Know all Men by these presents that we George A. Beesman & Meig Roth are held and firmly unto the City of Peoria in the penal sum of one hundred dollars lawful money of the United States, for the payment of which well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves our heirs and administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents, witness our hands and this 30<sup>th</sup> day of March 1850.

The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the said City of Peoria, did, on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of March 1850 before D. Blakeley Mayor of said City, recover a judgment against the above bounden George A. Beesman for the sum of twenty five 100 dollars fine, from which judgment the said G. A. Beesman has taken an appeal to the Circuit Court of the county of Peoria aforesaid, and State of Illinois. Now if the said George A. Beesman shall prosecute his appeal with effect and shall pray whatever judgment may be rendered by the court upon dismissal of trial of said property appeal, then the above obligation to be void, otherwise to remain in full force and effect,
