Subject to the following condition thereinafter written to wit: That if the aforesaid James Davin should faithfully and impartially discharge the duties required of him as clerk of the County Commissioners South of Pike County in the State of Illinois aforesaid by an act of the Legislature of the State of Illinois entitled an "act concerning the public revenue approved February twenty seventh 1835" then the above mentioned Bond to be void otherwise to remain in full force effect.

Nevertheless the said Plaintiff in fact saith that after the making the said writing obligatory to wit on the first day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight a large sum of money to wit the sum of two thousand ~~for~~ five hundred and ninety two dollars and fifty cents being the amount of taxes due on the non-resident delinquent list of the year 1837 furnished for collection by the Auditor of public accounts, the interest on the same to the first day of March 1838, & the printers fees for advertising five hundred and fifty two tracts of land on said list was collected in pursuance of his duty as clerk as aforesaid by the said James Davin to and for the use of the people of the State of Illinois as aforesaid and was still is withheld and unpaid to the said people of the State of Illinois contrary to the true effect of the said writing obligatory and the conditions thereof by the reason whereof the said writing obligatory became forfeited and whereby an action hath accrued to the said people of the State of Illinois to demand and have of the said Defendants the sum of five

thousand dollars above demanded

said Defendants have hitherto wholly neglected
and refused and still do ^{neglect &} refuse to pay to the
