for a new trial formerly entered herein
over rules the same. It is therefore ordered
and considered that the plaintiff have
and recover of the defendant the sum
of three Hundred dollars his damages,
so assessed as aforesaid as also his
costs and charges herein expended and
that he have execution therefor. And
thereupon the Defendant prays an appeal
to the Supreme Court of this State
which is allowed on condition that he
enter into bonds in the sum of Six
Hundred Dollars, to be filed within
thirty days with surety to be approved
by the Clerk.

And thereafter to wit on the 17th day of
November A.D. 1860 was filed a Bond in
the Office of the Clerk of our said Circuit
Court, which is in words and figures as
follows to wit;

Know all men by these
Presents that we Albert P. Dake and
John J. Murphy are held and firmly
bound unto George D. Greenleaf in the
penal sum of Six Hundred Dollars
lawful money of the United States for the
payment of which well and truly to be

made me bind ourselves, our heirs
and administrators jointly severally
and firmly by these presents

Witness our hands and seals this
19th day of November A.D. 1860.

The Condition of the above obligation
is such whereas the said George D Greenleaf
did on the 26th day of October A.D.
1860 in the Circuit Court of the County of
McHenry receive a Judgement against the
above Complainant Gilbert P. Duke for the
Sum of Three Hundred Dollars and
Cents and costs of suit from which
said Judgement the said Gilbert P. Duke
has taken an appeal to the Supreme Court
of the State of Illinois. Now if the
said Gilbert P. Duke shall prosecute
his appeal with Effect and shall pay
whatever Judgement may be rendered
by the Court upon dismissal or
trial of said appeal, then the above
obligation to be void otherwise to remain
in full force and Effect
