## ABSTRACT OF THE RECORD.

RECORD.

On the 24th day of August, 1857, the appellant filed his bill in Chancery in the Circuit Court of Livingston County, which said bill is in substance as follows, to wit: That on or about the 14th day of September, A. D. 1855, your orator (the said appellant) did, in accordance to the rule of the General Land Commissioner of the General Land Office, and concurred in by the Secretary of the Interior at Washington City, District of Columbia, make and enter, on the records in said office, as the said Commissioner had a legal right to do, a select list of lands, by forty acre tracts, amounting to the amount of 15,835 86-100 acres, according to the government surveys, as made and filed in the said General Land Office, by the order of the government of the United States of America, and approved by the said government of the United States; that on the said 14th day of September he made application, in accordance with the rules of the General Land Office, for the privilege of contesting the right of the State of Illinois to the list herein, marked A., (see Record, pages 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26 and 27,) and made a part of this bill, by numbers, sections, townships, and ranges; that the said department did regard the said application as being properly made by you orator and binding on the said government; that in the month of May, A. D. 1856, the said department issued an order, in accordance to the form in such case made provided, accompanied with a list, that your orator had a right to contest, attached to the said order, (A.,) copy of which will be exhibited on the final hearing of this case, and the grounds on which I, your orator, should be allowed to enter the said lands, named in said application, exclusively as against all the world was, that your said orator should cause the lands to be surveyed and properly marked, and show a time to be named, that such time as he should be called upon so to do, to prove that more than twenty acres out of each forty acre tract (or over one-half of each quarter quarter section) was dry and fit for cultivation of all ordinary seasons, without artificial drainage or embankment, and that this was the character of the lands on the 28th day of September, 1850, being the day on which the swamp land act was passed; that your orator has complied, on his part, with all the requirements of the department required of him, and the conditions have been, on his part, fully complied with, and he is and was prepared to prove from the date of his said application; and further, your orator charges that on or about the first day of the month of January, A. D. 1857, that the Commissioner of the General Land Office issued his directory notice to the Register and Re-

ceiver of the Land Office of the United States at Springfield, Illinois; the said Commissioner commanded the said Register and Receiver to give your orator notice to produce his proof in the case, and report the same to the said Commissioner for his approval or disapproval, first having submitted the same to the Surveyor General at his office in the city of St. Louis and State of Missouri. The Register and Receiver received 4 the said notice on or about the 10th day of January, A. D. 1857. And your orator charges that he went in person to the said Register and Receiver of the said Land Office at the said city of Springfield, Illinois, on or about the 12th day of January, A. D. 1857, and demanded of the said Register and Receiver of said office to set a day for the hearing of the evidence in the said contested case of this your orator and the said State of Illinois; and your orator charges that, by the wrong acts of the said Register and Receiver, your orator was prevented from completing his contest, and from getting said lands described in said list of lands; and your orator avers that the Register and Receiver were the agents of the government of the United States of America, and that the government of the United States is bound to make good all wrongs done by them as such agents to your orator; and your orator avers that, by the act of Congress, passed on the twenty-eighth day of September, A. D. 1850, that the State of Illinois had no legal or equitable right to select any tract of land, as swamp or overflowed lands, except such tracts of land as were more than one half of each forty acre tract, or other legal sub-division, covered with water, or so spongy or wet and swampy that it could not 5 have been plowed on the twenty-eighth day of September, 1850, (and those lands were to be selected by the Secretary of the Interior from the original maps and plats, as returned by the government surveyors, and in no other way,) and on no other day, for the lands that were more than one-half not wet and swampy or overflowed on the date of the grant, did not pass by virtue of the grant, and that all selections that were made by the agents of the said State of Illinois, that was not covered more than one-half of each legal sub-division in water, or was a swamp or wet that it could not have been cultivated in some way or other, without artificial drainage or embankment, was a fraud on the government, and could not pass by or under the grant, and therefore is not within the meaning of the act of Congress of the third of March, 1857, confirming all the original selections, (except those in said act.) Your orator avers that the intention of the last mentioned act proceeds on the ground that the original selections were in accordance with the letter and spirit of the original grant. Your orator further avers, that not a tract of land named or described or meant in the list of lands made part of this bill, that was of that class; but, on the contrary, there was no one tract in said list but was more than one-half of each legal sub-division of qr. qr. section, or each forty acre lot or tract, either fractional or whole, but what was dry land and fit for cultivation on the 28th day of September, A. D. 1850; and further, your orator avers, that the list of lands selected and claimed by the said State of Illinois, by said State transferred to said County of Livingston, meaning the list here claimed and set out by your orator, did need the construction of levees or artificial drain to reclaim the said list of lands, nor any tract of said land, on the said twentyeighth day of September, A. D. 1850, that being the day on which said

grant was made by the General Government to the said State of Illinois; and if not covered in water by being overflowed, or so swampy that it could not be cultivated, say more than one-half of each tract, it could not legally and, therefore, did not pass to the said State of Illinois; and if it did not pass to the said State, the said State could not pass any title to said County, as claimed by said County; and further, your orator avers that the said State of Illinois did, on the 22d day of June, 1852, by virtue of an act of the legislature, in general assembly assembled, did enact to convey, by their acts, all the right and title that they had to all the lands named in this bill-but the express conditions on which the said County was to have the lands on was, that the said County should fully and legally do to said lands, in order to reclaim them, the same as the said State of Illinois was bound to do; and your orator avers that the said County of Livingston did not comply with the condition precedent, which was the very essence of the grant from the said State to the said County, meaning fully to enjoin on the said County every enjoinder by said act of June 22d, 1852, and the condition was to be mutual on the part of both; and your orator avers that there was no consideration passing from the County to the State, unless the said County complied fully with all the conditions named in said act; and your orator avers that said County did not comply and has not complied with the requirements of the said act of the legislature, and that thereby the original grant to the said State became forfeited; and that further, that by subsequent acts of the legislature, the said State has forfeited her right to the lands by granting said lands to the counties in which they, the lands, lie, in not requiring the said counties to expend the proceeds of said sales to levees and drains to render the said land susceptible of cultivation, the said State of Illinois forfeited all right under the original grant from the said government of the said United States of America to the said lands described in this bill; and further, your orator avers, that by the grant of the Commissioner of the General Land Office, made to your orator on condition that he would prove that more than one-half of each tract or parcel-meaning a quarter quarter of section or tract named in this bill-to be dry or fit for cultivation, without artificial drainage or embankment, because a binding contract by which government by her proper agents is bound to convey to your orator the said lands herein described; and the express condition on the part of the government was, to receive one dollar and twenty-five cents in money, or its equivalent in government scrip or land warrants, and that the said government would sell the land to no other person except your orator, on the condition that your orator would prove that more than one-half of each quarter quarter section, or other legal sub-division of said tracts by forty acre tracts, was dry and fit for cultivation, without artificial drainage or embankment, and that was the character of the said lands on the said 28th day of September, A. D. 1850; and your orator avers that he was prepared, on the 14th day of September, A. D. 1855, to prove at any time—that the government might have called for the same—that more than one-half of each legal sub-division of each quarter quarter section, or other legal sub-division of the said described lands, was dry and fit for cultivation, without artificial drainage or embankment, and that was the character of the said lands on the 28th day of September, 1850; and

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your orator avers that he always has been and still is ready and able and desirous and demands the privilege of proving that said lands are not of the character named in the act of September 28th, 1850, to comply with each and every request-that the said government of the United States of America enjoins by her agents, to wit: The Commissioner of the General Land Office, located at the city of Washington, D. C.; and your orator avers that more than one-half of each tract of land was dry and fit for cultivation on the 28th day of September, A. D. 1850, and still is the character of the same, and was fit for cultivation without artificial drainage or embankment; and your orator avers that he has always been ready and able and desirous to have paid the government for all the lands in this bill described, according to the contract with the said government, at any day that the said government should have called on him to do by virtue of the said contract; and that your orator has frequently and in a friendly manner called on the government, by calling on the Commissioner of the General Land Office, and desiring him to set a day for the determination and closing up of the said contract, but he neglected to do-promising that he would. Your orator charges that he has delayed the same to a time far beyond what was necessary, and that he now refuses to comply with and carry out his contract, on the part of the general government, with your orator-and that your orator is still willing and ready to pay, and hereby tenders the proof required of him to carry out his contest successfully with the government, hereby asking and desiring that your orator may be permitted to bring the money into Court and pay the same over to a commissioner to be appointed to receive the 11 said money from your orator, and convey each and every tract of the said lands named in this bill, or the schedule attached, to your said orator; and your orator further avers, that he has expended the sum of three thousand dollars in carrying out the directions of the government, which is part of the consideration money between your orator and the government for the said lands, and that he has only been prevented from completing his contest by the bad faith of the government in conveying the said lands to the said County of Livingston and State of Illinois, through the said State of Illinois, and not by any laches on the part of your orator. He further avers, that he has done each and everything that the said government required of him until they, the said government, fraudulently, wrongfully and unlawfully refused to complete their contract by passing a retrospective law, which they, the said general government, by their representatives in Congress assembled, had no legal right so to do, and therefore the government had no legal right to refuse to carry out their contract with your orator in the contest about the said tracts of land with the said state of Illinois. And further, your orator avers, that the government has no legal right to cause a citizen or subject of her govern-12 ment to expend money to detect frauds committed against the government, committed by other citizens or subjects, and when it became apparent that he would show that he was successful in the matter to then turn around and defraud the said subject out of the reward by contract he was promised or agreed to be paid for performing the services, nor to permit him to do part of the contract on his part, and then prevent him from completing the whole, and then make that, their wrong acts, an excuse to not perform their part of the contract in any manner nor under

any pretext, for if the lands were not of the character specified and named in the original grant, then your orator avers, that he is entitled to the said lands by virtue of his right of application, and that a prior right for having been at an expense of detecting the frauds of the original selector of the said lands; and further, your orator represents, that on or about the 22d day of June, A.D. 1852, and on divers other days, the said legislature of the state of Illinois has passed laws granting the said lands to the several counties in the state of Illinois, and, amongst others, to the county of Livingston in said state of Illinois; and that, by said acts, the said state of Illinois conveyed to the said county the said lands named in and made a part of this bill. Your orator avers, that the said state of Illinois has no legal right to grant the said lands, what the State of Illinois could rightfully have taken, except the right had been conferred upon the said State by the act of Congress granting, much less to have granted the said lands without enjoining on the County receiving the same to have performed the whole contract with government that the said State was bound to do, in order to hold the said lands; and your orator avers, that the said State did not bind the said County in the same manner that the said State was bound to the general government. Your orator avers, that the said State of Illinois had no legal right to grant the said lands, that would pass to the said State by virtue of the act of the 28th September, 1850, rightfully sold to the County in which the said lands lie, from the fact that the grant was not equal amongst the whole people of the State of Illinois, all had an equal right in and to the fee of said lands, that right fully passed under the grant; and your orator avers, that those land did not pass, for they were not the class of lands that did pass by the grant; and your orator prays that the County of Livingston and State of Illinois be made parties, defendants to this, your orator's bill, as by statute in such case made and provided; and that your orator charges that the selecting of each and every tract of land named in this bill of complaint was a fraud on the government of the United States of America, and that not a tract of them could possibly, under any circumstances, be called swamp or overflowed lands. Your orator prays your honor to grant to your orator the following reliefs: that you will direct that a commissioner be appointed to receive the sum of one dollar and twenty-five cents, in lawful funds, for each and every acre of the said lands named and described in the schedule of lands to this bill annexed, and on the payment aforesaid to make and execute to your orator a good, clear and perfect title to the said lands as against the said County of Livingston and the said State of Illinois, in the said State of Illinois, could or may have by the said grant from the said State of Illinois. Second, that your Honor will name the time, the place where, and the kind of funds or money that your orator shall pay to the said County of Livingston and State of Illinois for the said lands, provided that your Honor shall find that said County had any legal or equitable right to said lands named in the said bill. Third, that your Honor will decree that your orator is entitled to the said lands named in said bill by virtue of his contract with the said government of the United States, on the ground that the said lands did not pass by virtue of the said grant, because they are not among the class of lands named in said grant. Your orator prays that the said defendants be compelled to, on their corporeal oaths, to the

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matters aforesaid, and that as fully and particularly as if the same were here repeated, and the said County, by her authorities, distinctly interrogated thereto, and especially that said County, by her authority, may, in manner aforesaid, answer and set forth in their answer whether the selector went on to each and every tract of land claimed by said County that is named in this this, your orator's bill of complaint, and found by proper measurement that more than one-half of each quarter quarter section, or other legal sub-division, was overflowed or swampy on the said 28th day of September, A. D. 1850; and, further, whether each and every tract of land, named in said bill of complaint, was, on the twentyeighth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty, meaning to say, that to have them say, whether more than one-half of each quarter quarter section, or other legal sub-division of said lands, was, on the said 28th day of September, A.D. 1850, covered by overflow or actual swamp, so that it could not be cultivated without artificial drainage or embankment, and to have them point out in their answer what part of each of said lands was so overflowed or swampy on the said 28th day of September, 1850, aforesaid. Your orator prays that the grant of the said State to the said County may be set aside, and that whatever patents that said County, or whatever title the said County may have shall be surrendered to your Honor and cancelled, and that your orator have, by the decree of your honorable Court, the full fee and perfect title to said lands, all which, for your orator charges that he has frequently called on the said defendants and requested them to surrender their pretended title to the said tracts of land, and they still persist, saying that they have a title to said lands, all of which actings and doings and refusal of said County or said defendants, meaning the said County of Livingston in the State of Illinois, by the said authorities, against equity and good conscience and tend to the manifest wrong and greatly to the injury of your said orator in the premises, and in consideration whereof, and forasmuch as your orator cannot have adequate relief in the premises in a court of equity only, where matters of this nature are only conisable and remediable; and further, your orator prays your Honor to grant to your orator all the several reliefs that your orator has 17 asked for, and all the general reliefs that your Honor may see, from the nature of the case and facts exhibited on the final hearing of this case, that he is entitled to in addition to those named and provided for, and on the equity arising between your orator and the general government of the United States of America, as may be in force in favor of your orator, against the government and the said defendants by the decree of this honorable Court, and if this honorable Court cannot decree title to your orator, that then your orator prays your Honor to decree that the said defendants pay to your orator what your orator can show, that all of the said lands in said bill, that he can show, does not come under the meaning of the act of the 28th of September, 1850, is worth per acre in lieu of said lands, if the said defendants should sell any or all of the said lands, named in this bill, the said money to be paid under the order or decree of this honorable Court. Your orator charges that said lands are worth now the sum of one hundred and fifty thousand dollars in lawful

best and utmost of their knowledge, remembrance, information and belief, full, true, direct and perfect answers, make to all and singular the

money; and further, is provided by your orator, that no sale that has been made or might be made of said lands by the said defendants shall have no prejudice against the title of your orator in any manner, and shall grant such other and further relief, in the premises, as to your Honor shall seem meet, &c.

Prayer for subpœna, &c.

Demurrer to complainant's bill, demurrer sustained with leave to complaintant to amend his bill.

Feb. 5, 1858, complainant filed his amended bill, which is in the words and figures following, to wit:

Your orator, John Clark, represents unto your Honor that the Government of the United States of America was the owner of the following described real estate, situated in said Livingston County, State of Illinois, to wit:

Reference being had to the list of lands filed with and made part of the original bill filed in this cause on the 24th day of August, 1857. And the said Government of the United States of America being so possessed, the said Government of the United States of America, by virtue of the acts of the Congress of the United States, had said lands, with others, surveyed and platted in accordance with the aforenamed description, offered the same for sale at their Land Office at Danville, at the said State of Illinois, at public vendue, and the said lands, not being sold at said public sale, they became subject to private sale at said Land Office at Danville, at the price of one dollar and twenty-five cents per acre. And whereas, said government of the United States, in Congress assembled, passed an act entitled "An Act to enable the State of Arkansas and other States to reclaim the swamp lands within their limits;" which said act was approved by the President of the United States on the 28th day of September, 1850, and on said day became a law, by which law all swamps and overflowed lands within the State of Illinois were donated to said State, and by which act the proceeds and overflowed lands were to be used for the purposes of draining the same. Reference being had to said act of Congress. And afterward the legislature of the State of Illinois passed an act entitled "An Act to dispose of the swamp and overflowed lands to pay the expense of selecting and surveying the same," which said act was approved by the Governor of the State of Illinois on the twenty-second of June, 1852, and which said act became a law and in full force in said State of Illinois; and by the terms and conditions of said law, and the act of the State of Illinois and directory thereto, all the swamps and overflowed lands which had been donated to the State of Illinois by the said act of Congress, approved September 28, 1850, were donated to the several counties in which the same were situated, and the county surveyors of the said several counties in the State were authorized to survey said swamp and overflowed lands-reference being had to said lands named last.

Your orator would further represent unto your Honor, that by virtue of said law of Congress, and said law of the legislature of Illinois, the County Surveyor of Livingston county selected and reported all of the before referred to tracts of land to the Auditor of the State of Illinois as

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money; and further, is provided by your orator, that no sale that has been made or might be made of said lands by the said defendants shall have no prejudice against the title of your orator in any manner, and shall grant such other and further relief, in the premises, as to your Honor shall seem meet, &c.

Prayer for subpœna, &c.

Demurrer to complainant's bill, demurrer sustained with leave to complaintant to amend his bill.

Feb. 5, 1858, complainant filed his amended bill, which is in the words and figures following, to wit:

Your orator, John Clark, represents unto your Honor that the Government of the United States of America was the owner of the following described real estate, situated in said Livingston County, State of Illinois, to wit:

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Your orator would further represent unto your Honor, that by virtue of said law of Congress, and said law of the legislature of Illinois, the County Surveyor of Livingston county selected and reported all of the before referred to tracts of land to the Auditor of the State of Illinois as

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swamp and overflowed lands, and the same were reported by the Auditor to the United States. Your orator would further represent unto your Honor, that all of said before described lands are good, arable lands, are susceptible of cultivation, and that the same are not swamp and overflowed lands, and that they need no draining whatever to render them susceptible of cultivation, and that all of the said lands are dry and as good as the average of the lands in the State of Illinois, and that the same do not come within the meaning of said law before referred to .-Your orator would further represent unto your Honor, that after the passage of said law before referred to, and before the commencement of this 36 suit, to wit: on the fourteenth day of September, in the year eighteen hundred fifty-five, your orator applied in writing to the Commissioner of the General Land Office of the United States of America for leave to contest the right of the County of Livingston, State of Illinois, in and to said lands through the proper officers of the government of the United States, that said lands did not come within the purview and meaning of said law of Congress donating the said lands to the State of Illinois, and for leave to purchase the said lands from the government of the United States at their Land Office at Danville in the State of Illinois; and the said Commissioner, acting under the direction and by the authority of the government of the United States, authorised your orator in writing, in his official character, to prepare his proofs and to contest the right of the State and the County of Livingston in and to said lands. And in consequence of said promises of said government of the United States, by their officers, to your orator, he caused said lands to be surveyed and examined by a competent surveyor and chainman, and that he was to great expense in employing the surveyor, chainman, axman, and the necessary hands and teams to mark and examine the said lands and ascertain the quality of the same, and in paying such surveyor, chainman, axman and teamsters. And your orator further charges, that said lands being owned by the United States of America, and not being swamp and overflowed lands, within the meaning of the said law, that he applied to the Register at the Land Office at Danville, Illinois, in the month of December, in the year 1855, for leave to purchase from said government of the United States all of said lands, and he tendered to the Receiver of the Land Office at Danville, Illinois, the purchase money for said lands at the rate of one dollar twenty-five cents (\$1.25) per acre, in gold, American gold coin, under the authority of the said government, and that the said Register refused to let your orator enter the same, or to acknowledge the application in writing; and the said Receiver refused to receive said purchase money in gold coin for said lands, or to acknowledge the tender of the same in writing; and that, after making the survey of said lands and obtaining the proof as to the character and quality of said lands, and including the expense in regard to the character and quality of the same, your orator is still anxious and willing to purchase said lands from the 38 government of the United States, and hereby offers, and still ready and willing and claims the equitable right to purchase the same from the government of the United States at the price of \$1,25 per acre, but that said officers and servants of the government refused to permit your orator to purchase the said land from the government, or any part thereof .-Your orator would further represent unto your Honor, that the Congress

of the United States of America, on the third day of March, A. D. 1857, passed an act entitled An Act to confirm to the several States the swamp and overflowed lands selected under the act of September 28, 1850, and act of 2nd March, 1849, by the terms and conditions of which act all the swamp and overflowed lands lying within the State of Illinois, which had been selected by the agents of the State of Illinois, which were at the time owned by the government, were confirmed to the State of Illinois. Your orator would further represent unto your Honor, that none of the said before described lands are swamp and overflowed lands, and do not come within the purview and meaning of said act or law of the Congress of the United States. Your orator would further represent unto your Honor, that in all the actings and doings of your orator, that he has acted in good faith with the government of the United States, and by the direction and instruction of the said government, by the officers thereof who had the charge of the public lands thereof. Your orator further charges, that said government put your orator into peaceable possession of the said land, when they, the said government, by the written direction of the said Commissioner of the said Land Office, directed him to have the said tracts of land surveyed and marked, and to prepare his proof, to prove that they were not swamp and overflowed lands; and that said government agreed, if he could prove the said tracts of land to not be swamp or overflowed land, that he, your orator, should have the said lands for the sum of one dollar twenty-five cents per acre; and your orator avers and charges, that he did do in a reasonable time all that he was directed or told by the government that he should do to complete the contract on his part. And further your orator charges, that the County of Livingston claims, or pretends to claim, all of said lands before described or referred to, by virtue of the said several laws of Congress and of the said State of Illinois, and that the said County has had the said lands appraised, and is offering, through her said agents and servants, to sell the same, and threatening, through her said agents and servants, to sell off said lands, and to defraud your orator out of the same; and that the said County does not intend nor has not ordered that any part of the purchase money, they may receive for said lands, shall be used for the purpose of draining the same. And your orator further charges, that no ditching and draining is necessary to render the said lands fit for cultivation, but that the said lands are more than twenty acres in each forty acre tract dry, and was dry on the 28th day of September, A. D. 1850, and are now fitted for cultivation, and are susceptible of tillage and raising any of the crops that can be raised in said Livingston county. And the said complainant would further aver and charge, that in the survey and having the quality of said lands ascertained, that he expended the sum of three thousand dollars, and that he applied to the Register and Receiver of the Land Office of the United States to permit your orator to make proof of the character of said lands, and that he had the necessary and competent witnesses in attendance to prove the character of said lands, and that the same was not swamp or overflowed lands, but that the same was arable and susceptible of cultivation without any drainage whatever, and that the said officer of the government refused to receive the amount of \$1,25 per acre.

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Your orator further charges, that in having the said lands surveyed and inspected, that he surveyed and inspected each and every forty acre

tract of land described and set out in the original bill in this cause, and had the same inspected, and has proof of the same, and frequently offered and still offers to prove, to the satisfaction of the officers of the government of the United States at the Land Office, that all said lands are dry and fit for cultivation without any drainage whatever, and that the government of the United States, by their officers, refuse to permit your orator to make said proof, or to purchase said lands from the government, or to receive the purchase money for the same at the rate of one dollar and twenty-five cents per each acre thereof in gold coin. Your orator further charges, that the said County of Livingston had notice of all the before named actions of your orator, and that the government of the United States, by her said officers, fraudulently intended to cheat, wrong and defraud your orator. Your orator therefore charges, that the said 42 County of Livingston, conniving and confederating with the government of the United States, intending to defraud your orator out of said lands and out of the said sum of three thousand dollars by him expended in causing said lands to be surveyed and inspected. Your orator further charges, that said lists of lands are worth the full and just sum of one hundred and fifty thousand dollars of current money of the United States of America.
