and for the County of Union in the third judicial Circuit of the State
aforesaid of the Term of October anno domini one thousand eight
hundred and thirty four Before the Honorable

Thomas C. Brown Judge

Be it remembered that at the term aforesaid of said Circuit Court
on Friday the thirty first day of the Month and fifth day of the
Term the following Order was Taken

Jacob Tres plaintiff } In Tropp
against }

John Dougherty and
Leopold Andersen

And now at this day comes the plaintiff by A. Caldwell
his attorney and the defendant by D. Baker of Dougherty their
attorneys and issue being joined it was agreed by and between the
parties in presence of the Court that eight, instead of twelve jurors should
try the same and thereupon comes eight jurors To wit, William Holmes
John Knox, Uriah Martin, Jacob Zimmerman, John W. McLeary, John
Frogge, Matthew Stokes, and Thomas Phelps, who being elected tried
and sworn well and truly to try the issue joined, upon their oaths
do say "We of the jury find the defendant guilty and assess the plaintiff
damages to thirty dollars" Jacob Zimmerman foreman" - and there
upon the defendant moves the Court to award them a new trial where
said motion was continued for argument.

On Saturday the sixth day of the Term and first day
of November 1834 the parties appeared and the following
Order was entered To wit

Jacob Treas Plaintiff
against
Champion Anderson &
John Dougherty

And now at this day comes as well the said
Plaintiff by A. C. Cady his attorney as the 2^d def^t by Baker and Dougherty
their attorneys to the Court being now sufficiently advised of & concerning
the said defendants Motion for a new trial, it is ordered that the same
be & it is overruled

Therefore it is considered that the said Plaintiff recover against
the said defendants thirty dollars the damages aforesaid by them given
in form aforesaid assessed to the defendants in Mercy &c
And there upon the said defendants bring an appeal herein to the Supreme
Court of this State which appeal is allowed to them upon their entering
into bond in the office of the Clerk of this Court with George Dougherty
as their security within twenty days from the date hereof in the
sum of sixty dollars conditioned as the law directs -

And in pursuance of the foregoing order the defendants
gave their bond as above directed on the Twenty first day
of November 1834 - conditioned as the law directs -
