Know all men by these presents that
we William Ogle and Isaac Cox, of the County
of Madison in the State of Illinois, are held
and firmly bound unto Annanias Coffey
for the use of John Beck, in the sum of
One hundred and fifty dollars, of lawful
money, for payment whereof well and truly
to be made, we bind Ourselves, Our heirs,
Executors and administrators, jointly and se-
verally, firmly by these presents, signed with
our hands, and sealed with Our seals,
this Tenth day of March, Anno Domini,
One Thousand eight hundred and Thirty four.

The condition of the above obligation
is such, That whereas the above bound William
Ogle, is about to apply to the Clerk of the Su-
preme Court of the State of Illinois, for a writ
of Error, in a certain case in which judgment
was rendered against him, in the Circuit Court of
the County of Madison aforesaid, on the 30th
day of May A. D. 1833, at the suit of the said
A. Coffey for the use of John Beck, for sixty nine
dollars and thirty cents debt, Ten dollars and eighteen
cents damages, and also the Costs: Now if the said
William Ogle shall pay the Judgment, Costs,
Interest and damages, in case said Judgment
shall be affirmed by the Supreme Court, and that
he will duly prosecute his said writ of error:

If the above obligation to be void, else to
remain in full force and virtue.
