Be it remembered that heretofore to wit, on the thirteenth day of August in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty said day being one of the days of the August Term of said Court, the following among other proceedings was had in said Court and entered of Record, to wit:

George W. Traver

C. B. Waite Assumpsit

This day comes the said plaintiff by Ward and Stanford his attorneys and due personal service of process of summons issued in this cause having been had on the said defendant, and being three times solemnly called in open Court comes not, nor does any person for him but herein he makes default, which is on motion ordered to be taken, and is hereby entered of record. Wherefore said plaintiff ought to have and recover of the said defendant his damages sustained herein by reason of the premises, and the Court now here after hearing the allegations and proofs submitted by the said plaintiff, and being fully advised in the premises assesses his damages herein to the sum of One hundred and six dollars and ninety one Cents.

Therefore it is Considered that
the said plaintiff do have and
recover of the said Defendant
his damages of One hundred
and six dollars and Ninety
one cents in form aforesaid
Assessed, and also his Costs
and Charges in this behalf Ex-
pended and have Execution
therefor.

And thereupon the said de-
fendant prays an appeal herein
to the Supreme Court of this State
which is allowed to him upon
filing his appeal bond in the
penalty of two hundred and fifty
dollars with security to be approved
by a judge of the Court to be
paid in thirty days from this date

And afterwards to wit: on the
Sixteenth day of August in
the year aforesaid the defendant
filed herein his appeal bond
in the words and figures following
to wit:




Know all men by these presents
that we C B Waite and William
C Goudy are held and firmly
bound unto George W Traver
in the penal sum of two hundred
and fifty dollars lawful money
of the United States, for the pay-
ment of which said sum, well
and truly to be made, we
bind ourselves our heirs, Executors
and administrators, jointly and
severally by these presents.

Sealed with our seals and dated
this Sixteenth day of August
A D 1860.

The Condition of the above
obligation is such, that whereas
the above bounden C B Waite
has on the day of the date hereof

prayed an appeal from the
Superior Court of Chicago to the
Supreme Court of Illinois from a
judgment rendered against C. P.
Waite in said Court in favor of
said Erarer for the sum of \$106,100
on the 13th day of August A.D. 1860.

Now if the said C. P. Waite shall
prosecute his said appeal with
effect and shall pay the said
judgment costs interests & damages
in case the judgment shall be
affirmed then the above obligation
to be void, otherwise to remain
in full force and effect.
