At a term of the Circuit Court, begun and held at the Court House, within and for the County of Tazewell and State of Illinois, on the first Monday of June, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty nine, the same being the 6th day of said Month of June. Present the Hon. James Harriott, Judge of the 21st Judicial Circuit of the State of Illinois.

Thomas C. Reeves, Sheriff. and Merrill C. Young, Clerk. Among the Proceedings of said Court, at said Term, are found the following, to wit:

Now come the plaintiff by his attorney, C. Turner, and the defendant having been regularly served with process, was three times solemnly called, came not, but made default. It is therefore considered by the Court, that the plaintiff hath

sustained damages, by reason of the breaches of promises in the Declaration mentioned; But because those damages are unknown to the Court, the Clerk is ordered to make an assessment thereof. And he, having assessed those damages to the sum of Two hundred Seventy five & 88/100 (\$275.⁸⁸/₁₀₀) dollars, and made report thereof, which is approved by the Court.

It is therefore ordered and adjudged by the Court, that the Plaintiff recovers of said Defendant, the damages aforesaid, in form aforesaid assessed, and likewise the costs & charges, by him about his suit expended, and that Execution issue therefor.

Whereupon an appeal is prayed, which is allowed by the Court, with Bond to be filed in ten days, with Teis Smittle as security, in sum of Four hundred dollars. (\$400.)

And afterwards, to wit, on the 25th day of June A.D. 1859 an Appeal Bond was filed in the words and figures following, to wit:

Know all men by these presents, that
We Charles Grondenberg and Feis
Smith are held and firmly bound
unto Peter Rue, in the penal sum
of Four hundred dollars, for the payment
of which, well and truly ~~performed~~
to be made and performed, we bind
ourselves, our heirs, executors and
administrators, jointly, severally and
firmly by these presents, witness our
hands and seals the 25th day of
June 1859

The condition of this obli-
gation is such, that Whereas, at the
June Term 1859 of the Tazewell Circuit
Court, the above named Peter Rue
recovered a judgment against the above
bounden Charles Grondenberg, for the
sum of Two hundred seventy five $\frac{88}{100}$
Dollars, and costs of suit from which
said judgment, said Charles Grondenberg
has prayed an appeal to the Supreme
Court of the State of Illinois.

Now if the said Grondenberg shall
pay said judgment, costs, interest
and Damages, in case said judgment
shall be affirmed, and duly pros-
ecute said appeal, then this bond

to be void, otherwise to remain in full force.
