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Jackson County Circuit Court December Special term 1860

At a Special Term of the Jackson County Circuit Court began and held in the Court House in the Town of Murphysboro Jackson County State of Illinois, on Monday December 3rd AD 1860.

Present the Honorable Alexander M Jenkins, Judge of the Third Judicial Circuit, and presiding Judge of the Jackson County Circuit Court.

Whereupon the Following Order was made.

Wednesday December 11th 1860

And now on this day came the Plaintiff by his Attorneys Allen, Egan and Thomas, and the Defendants by their Attorneys Haynie & Parrish, parties waived Trial by jury, joined Issue and Submitted the Cause to the Court for Trial, and after hearing of the Evidence, Entered a Verdict Finding the Defendants Guilty and Awards the Plaintiffs Damage at One hundred and ten dollars,

It is therefore Ordered by the Court that the Plaintiff have judgment for and against the Defendants

for the Sum of One hundred and two dollars damage
together with the Costs of this Suit, and may have
Execution therefor. Whereupon Motion is made by
Defendants ^{attorneys} for a New Trial, Motion for a New
Trial Overruled by the Court. They then pray for
an Appeal to the Supreme Court of the State of
Illinois. Appeal Granted by Filing Bond within
Thirty days from this date in the penal Sum of
Two hundred and Fifty dollars Conditioned according
to Law with J. V. Haynie as Security, to be approved
of by the Clerk in Vacation.

And afterwards to Wit on the 26th day of December
A.D. 1860. The following Appeal Bond was filed which
is in Words and Figures as follows to Wit.

I know all men by these presents that We the
Illinois Central Rail road Company and Icham
J. Haynie are held and firmly bound unto Ann
Byers in the penal Sum of Two hundred and fifty
dollars lawful Money of the United States for the
payment of which well and truly to be made We
and our heirs our heirs executors and Administra-
tors jointly severally and firmly by these presents
Witnes Our hands and Seals this 19th day of Decem-
ber A.D. 1860.

The Condition of the above obligation is Such
that Whereas the said Ann Byers did on the 11th

day of December AD 1860. before the Circuit Court
of the County of Jackson and State of Illinois, never
a judgment against the above named Illinois
Central Railroad Company for the sum of One
thousand and Ten dollars and Costs of Suit from
which judgment the said Illinois Central Rail-
road Company has taken an Appeal to the Supreme
Court of the State of Illinois. Now if the said
Illinois Central Railroad Company shall duly
prosecute their Appeal, and with effect and shall
pay the judgments, costs, interests, and damages,
in case said judgment shall be affirmed
then the above obligation to be void otherwise to
be and remain in full force and effect
