Whereas, on the *eightth* day of *March* in the year of
our Lord 1843 the above named defendants *Joseph McCool,*
James T. Smith and Thomas J. Turner —
executed their bond under their hands and seals
to "The People of the State of Illinois" in the penal sum of *two thousand*
dollars, conditioned that if the said defendant *Joseph*
McCool should perform all the duties required to be performed by him as
Collector of the County of *Stephenson* in the time and manner prescri-
bed by law, and when he should be succeeded in office should surrender and deliver over
to his successor in office, all books, papers and monies belonging to said county last men-
tioned or the State and appertaining to his said office, then the said bond should be void,
otherwise to remain in full force. And whereas the said defendant *Joseph*
McCool as Collector of the public revenue of the said county of *Stephenson*
for the year 1843 hath not performed ~~all~~ the duties required to be performed by
him as such collector in the time and manner prescribed by law, but hath neglected the
same in this, to wit: That of the State revenue for the year 1843 by him collected in
his capacity as Collector of the said County of *Stephenson* he failed to pay
over to the Treasurer of the State of Illinois, the sum of *two hundred and*
eighty six $\frac{3}{100}$ dollars, on or before the first Monday of March in the
of our Lord 1844 as by law required; and hath even since failed and neglected to do
so.

Now Therefore the above named defendants are hereby notified that on the
fifteenth day of *December* in the year 1845 at the term
of the *Supreme* Court, then to be holden at the City of Springfield, in
the County of Sangamon and State aforesaid, or as soon thereafter during the said
term as counsel can be heard, I will move said Court for and on behalf of the said Peo-
ple of the State of Illinois, for judgment upon the said bond, against each and all of the
said defendants for the sum of *two hundred and eighty six* \$¹⁰⁰ dollars,
the amount of public revenue so due and unpaid, as aforesaid, with ten per cent per
month interest thereon from the said first ~~Monday~~ ^{September} of ~~March~~, in the year 1844 un-
til judgment.

they have, why such judgment should not be rendered.

month interest thereon from the said first Monday of March, in the year 18*44* un-
til judgment.
