The People of State of Illinois by B. G. Cook their  
atty. Complain of Andrew J. Wagner Joseph Wag-  
ner, George Walker, Charles L. Bonney, Samuel J.  
Stilson, William B. Wade, George Wallace John Carrier,  
Thomas Hoadley, David Green and George R. Richard-  
son survivors of Peter J. Wagner Defendants summon-  
ed &c. of a plea that they render to said plaintiff the sum  
of fifteen thousand dollars which they owe to and unjust-  
ly detain from said plaintiff. For that heretofore to wit  
on the 1<sup>st</sup> Tuesday day of November A.D. 1848 was duly elected  
Treasurer of the County of LaSalle in said State of Illinois  
and then and there accepted said office and the said de-  
fendants and the said Peter J. Wagner who since that time  
and before the commencement of this suit deceased heretofore  
to wit on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of November A.D. 1849 executed and  
filed in the office of the Clerk of the County Court of said  
County their bond by which they bound themselves to the  
plaintiff to pay to said plaintiff the sum of fifteen thou-  
sand dollars which bond was <sup>dated</sup> executed the day and year  
aforesaid and was subject to the condition following there-  
under written. The condition of the above bond is such that  
if the above bondman Andrew J. Wagner shall perform all the  
duties required by law to be performed as treasurer of said  
County of LaSalle in the time and manner prescribed  
by law and when he shall be succeeded in office shall surren-  
der and deliver over to his successor in office, all books,  
papers, monies and other things belonging to said County  
and appertaining to his said office, then the above bond  
to be void otherwise to remain in force —

And the plaintiffs aver that said Andrew F. Wagner as treasurer of said LaSalle County afterwards to wit on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of May A.D. 1850 did receive a large sum of money collected in said County for State and County taxes to wit the sum of fifteen hundred dollars for State taxes and the sum of fifteen hundred dollars for County taxes which sum of money which was collected for State taxes it was the duty of said Andrew F. Wagner as treasurer of said County to have paid to the treasurer of the State of Illinois and the said sum of money which was collected for County taxes it was the duty of said Andrew F. Wagner as such treasurer to have paid to Brach Fellows who was duly elected and qualified as treasurer of said County afterwards to wit on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of November A.D. 1852 and who was successor in office to said Andrew F. Wagner as treasurer of said County.

Yet the said Andrew F. Wagner notwithstanding his duty as such treasurer of such County did neglect and refuse to pay to the treasurer of the State of Illinois the said sum of fifteen hundred dollars so received by said Andrew F. Wagner of money which was collected as and for State taxes as aforesaid and said Andrew F. Wagner did neglect and refuse to pay to Brach Fellows his successor in office as aforesaid the said sum of fifteen hundred dollars received as aforesaid by said Andrew F. Wagner as treasurer as aforesaid of money collected as County taxes as aforesaid.

Whereby an action hath accrued to the plaintiffs to have and demand of and from the said defendants the said sum of fifteen thousand dollars Yet though often requested the said defendants have never paid said sum money or any part thereof.

Know all men by these presents that we Andrew F. Wagner, Charles S. Penny, principal, and Peter J. Wagner, Joseph H. Wagner, George P. Walker, Charles S. Bonney, Samuel J. Stiles, William B. Wade, George Wallace, John C. Carr, Thomas Hoadley, David Green, George P. Richardson, Securites all of the County of LaSalle and State of Illinois are held and firmly bound to the people of the State of Illinois in the penal sum of fifteen thousand dollars for the payment of which, well and truly to be made we bind ourselves, each of us our heirs executors and administrators firmly by these presents, Signed with our hands and seals with our seals, dated at Ottawa this 15<sup>th</sup> day of November A.D. 1849. The condition of the above bond is such that if the above bond Andrew F. Wagner, shall perform all the duties required by law to be performed as treasurer of the said County of LaSalle in the time and manner prescribed by law and when he shall be succeeded in office shall render and deliver over to his successor in office all books, papers, monies and other things belonging to said County and appertaining to his said office, then the above bond to be void otherwise to remain in force.

La Salle County - The People of the State of Illinois,  
to the Sheriff of said County - Greeting:

Whereas, in a certain suit in our Supreme Court, in & for the third Division of said State, of a plea of debt, between the People of the State of Illinois plaintiffs, and Joseph H. Wagner, George T. Walker, Samuel T. Stiles, George Wallace, John Currier, Thomas Hoadley, George R. Richardson, William B. Wade & David Green impleaded with Andrew H. Wagner & Charles L. Bowley, defendants, such proceedings were therupon had in said Court, that the said plaintiffs ought to recover against said defendants, their damages on occasion of the premises: But because it is unknown to the Justices of our said Court, what damages the said plaintiffs have sustained by means of the premises aforesaid: We, therefore, command you, that you cause to come before you, forthwith, at the Court House in Ottawa, twelve good & lawful men of your County, who are in no wise of kin to the plaintiffs or defendants, to make a certain jury of the country, between the parties aforesaid, to inquire what damages the said plaintiffs have sustained, by reason of the premises aforesaid, in this behalf, & wherein the said defendants have made default; & have you then & there the names of the jurors aforesaid, together with this writ.
