to defend this suit but made default. It is therefore
~~assess~~ considered by the Court that the Plaintiffs
have and recover of the said defendants their dam-
ages and as those damages are unknown to the court
It is ordered by the court that the Clerk assess the same
and the Clerk having assessed and reported the damages
at the sum of Four Hundred and Eighty dollars and
Seventy two cents. It is therefore considered by the
court, that the Plaintiffs have and recover of the said
defendants the said sum of Four Hundred and
Eighty dollars and Seventy Two cents the damages
assessed as aforesaid together with their costs in this
suit laid out and expended. Thereupon came the
defendants and prayed an appeal to the Supreme
Court, which is allowed by the court. The defendants
to file Bill of exceptions & Bond (by agreement) in the
Penal sum of Eight Hundred dollars with Security to

be approved by the Clerk in Sixty days from this date
