At a term of the Hamilton County Circuit Court, begun and held at the Court house in M Searnsboro in said County and State aforesaid, ~~Monday~~ on the 22d day of October AD 1860 the same being the 4th Monday in said month, the following proceedings were had before the Honorable Edwin Beecher, presiding Judge of the Twelfth 12th Judicial Circuit of the State of Illinois, in and about the above named cause, to-wit:

William C. Myers. Appeal

Friday, October 26th, 1861.

Came the Plaintiff by Carpenter his attorney and the Defendant by Pollock his attorney, and by agreement, submitted this cause for trial, to the Court, together with the evidence both on the part of the plaintiff and defendant; and the Court being fully advised in the premises, it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover from the said defendant the sum of

fifty dollars, together with all the costs and charges of the said plaintiff in this suit. And the said defendant by Pallock his attorney prays his appeal to the Supreme Court, which is by the Court allowed on the said defendant entering into Bond for that purpose in 60 days from this date with William H. Campbell as his security in the sum of \$200. It is further ordered by the Court that the said defendant have leave to file ^ahis Bill of exceptions, on or before the first day of the next term of this Court.

Afterwards to-wit: on the 6th day of December A.D. 1860 came the said defendant William C. Myers and William H. Campbell his security and entered into the following bond, in words and figures following, to-wit:

Know all men by these presents that We William C. Myers Sarah E. Myers and William H. Campbell, all of the County of Hamilton and State of Illinois are held and firmly bound unto Joseph S. Williams of the County

of Hamilton and State of Illinois
~~are held and finally bound~~ in the
penal Sum of Two Hundred Dollars
lawful money of the United States
for the payment of which well and
truly to be made, we do bind ourselves
our heirs, executors, and administrators
firmly by these presents Sealed with our
Seals, and dated this the 6th day of
December in the year A.D. One thousand
Eight hundred and Sixty.

The Condition of the above obligation
is Such, that whereas the above bounden
William C. Myers and Sarah C. Myers
his wife have appealed from the judgment
of the Circuit Court of the said county
rendered at the October Term thereof A.
D. eighteen hundred and sixty wherein
Joseph S. Williams is plaintiff and the
said W. C. Myers and Sarah C. Myers
are defendants. Now if the said defen-
dants shall and do prosecute their said
appeal with effect, or in default thereof
shall pay whatever judgment may
be finally rendered therein and also
shall pay all such costs and charges
as may be assessed against them in
the premises then the above obliga-
tion shall be void otherwise to be and

remain in full force and virtue in law
