William L. D. Ewing auditor
of Public accounts of the State of Illinois complains of Isaac
R. Gavin John Welch George Sealy Thomas Sherott John
Knight J. E. Kellock John Ashman Benjamin Wilder
Samy W. Clark James Curtis Simon Donovan John Martin
John Massey & Chobson Kerchind defendants in this cause of
a plea that they render unto the said plaintiff the sum of
ten thousand dollars debt which to him they owe & from him
unjustly detain - For that whereas heretofore to wit: on the
30th day of August 1838. at the County of Cook in the said
State the said defendants by their certain writing obligatory
by them duly executed & delivered in pursuance of law signed
by them & sealed with their seals and now here to the Court
Shew the date whereof is the day & year aforesaid & that they
themselves to be held & firmly bound to the people of the State
of Illinois in the penal sum of ten thousand dollars
for the payment of which well & truly to be made they
bind each of themselves their heirs executors and administrators which said
writing obligatory was & is subject to a certain condition therein
expressed to wit: That if the above bounden Isaac R.
Gavin should faithfully & truly perform all the duties required
by law to be performed by him as Sheriff of the said County
of Cook then said writing obligatory should be void, otherwise
to be & remain in full force which said writing obligatory
aforesaid to wit: on the 25th day of May 1839 at the term
of the Cook Circuit Court then being holden in & for said County
of Cook in the State of Illinois was duly approved by the Judge
of the said Circuit Court. And plff avers from the date of the
said writing obligatory until & after the 17th day of June
in the Year A.D. 1840 the said Isaac R. Gavin was & continued
to be Sheriff of the said County of Cook. And plff says that
during the time aforesaid said Isaac R. Gavin did not faithfully

and truly perform all the duties required by law to be performed
by him as sheriff of said county in this to wit: That on the
eighteenth day of May 1840 he did receive into his
possession the sum of one hundred & forty nine dollars
of the Revenue of the said State for the Year 1839 and
also the sum of five dollars and sixty four cents for
printer's fee for advertising delinquent lands for the same
Year which said sum of money said Isaac H. Garin hath
ever since failed to pay over to the Treasurer of the said
State as by law required on or before the said 17th day of
June 1840 - by reason of which failure to make by
reason of which a fieri and premises an action hath
accrued to said plaintiff to have of & from said defendants
the said sum of ten thousand dollars the debt above
demanded nevertheless defendants have not paid the
same or any part thereof but so to do have ever & still
do refuse to pay damage five hundred dollars
& therefore this suit
