Sterling this 10th day of September 1848

The condition of the above bond is such that if the above bound Thomas S. Brockman shall perform all the duties required to be performed by him as Collector of the said County of Brown in the time and manner prescribed by law, and when he shall be succeeded in office shall surrender and deliver over to his successor in office all books papers and moneys belonging to said County or to the State, and appertaining to his said office then the above bond to be void otherwise to remain in full force signed sealed and delivered in presence of J. Whereas, on the *twelfth* day of *September* in the year of our Lord 1840 the above named defendants *Thomas S. Brockman William Stapleton Lewis Brockman Spencer Sordley and James Brockman* — executed their bond under their hands and seals

to "The People of the State of Illinois" in the penal sum of *Six thousand & three hundred &* dollars, conditioned that if the said defendant *Thomas S. Brockman* should perform all the duties required to be performed by him as Collector of the County of *Brown* — in the time and manner prescribed by law, and when he should be succeeded in office should surrender and deliver over to his successor in office, all the ^{books} papers and monies belonging to said county last mentioned or the State and appertaining to his said office, then the said bond should be void, otherwise to remain in full force. And whereas the said defendant *Thomas S.*

Brockman as Collector of the public revenue of the said county of *Brown* for the year 1840 hath not performed all the duties required to be performed by him as such collector in the time and manner prescribed by law, but hath neglected the same in this, to wit: That of the State revenue for the year 1840 by him collected in his capacity as Collector of the said County of *Brown* he failed to pay over to the Treasurer of the State of Illinois, the sum of *three hundred & sixty eight dollars, eight cents* dollars, on or before the first Monday of March in the year of our Lord 1841 as by law required; and hath even since failed and neglected to do so. And that of moneys collected by him for penalties for advertising delinquent lands for the same year he failed to pay over to the said Treasurer the sum of *eight dollars & fifty eight cents*, collected by him on or before the said first Monday of March 1841 as by law required & hath ever since so neglected & failed

Now Therefore the above named defendants are hereby notified that on the

tenth day of January in the year 1844 at the term
of the Supreme Court, then to be holden at the City of Springfield, in

the County of Sangamon and State aforesaid, or as soon thereafter during the said term as counsel can be heard, I will move said Court for and on behalf of the said People of the State of Illinois, for judgment upon the said bond, against each and all of the said defendants for the sum of three hundred & sixty eight $\frac{2}{100}$ dollars, the amount of public revenue so due and unpaid, as aforesaid, with ten per cent per month interest thereon from the said first Monday of March, in the year 1841 until judgment.

And also for the said sum of eight dollars and fifty eight cents printer fees as aforesaid collected by him as aforesaid.

when and where the said defendants are hereby notified to appear and show cause, if any they have, why such judgment should not be rendered.
