We command you, that you cause to come before the Justices of the Supreme Court, in and for the said State of Illinois, on the fifth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty six, at the Court Room in the City of Springfield, twelve good and lawful men, who are in possession of law to James Cheek, in a suit ^{or suits} between the people of the State of Illinois and the said James Cheek and others, to make a certain jury of the County between the parties aforesaid to enquire what damages the said People have sustained, by reason of the premises aforesaid, in this behalf wherein the said James Cheek and others have made default, and have you there and there the names of the jurors aforesaid - together with this writ.

Witness the Honorable William Wilson Chief Justice, of our said Court, and the seal thereof at Springfield this fifth day of February in the year of our Lord 1846

Whereas, on the eighth day of June in the year of our Lord 1841 the above named defendants James Chesny Thomas L. Dockett William J. Daff Francis Apperson & Martin Delany executed their bond under their hands and seals to "The People of the State of Illinois" in the penal sum of two thousand five hundred dollars, conditioned that if the said defendant James Chesny should perform all the duties required to be performed by him as Collector of the County of Clay — in the time and manner prescribed by law, and when he should be succeeded in office should surrender and deliver over to his successor in office, all books, papers and monies belonging to said county last mentioned or the State and appertaining to his said office, then the said bond should be void, otherwise to remain in full force. And whereas the said defendant James Chesny as Collector of the public revenue of the said county of Clay for the year 1841 hath not performed all the duties required to be performed by him as such collector in the time and manner prescribed by law, but hath neglected the same in this, to wit: That of the State revenue for the year 1841 by him collected in his capacity as Collector of the said County of Clay — he failed to pay over to the Treasurer of the State of Illinois, the sum of two hundred & seven teen ~~40~~ ⁴⁰ dollars, on or before the first Monday of March in the of our Lord 1842 as by law required; and hath even since failed and neglected to do

so.

Now Therefore the above named defendants are hereby notified that on the
 fifteenth day of January in the year 1845 at the term
 of the Supreme Court, then to be holden at the City of Springfield, in
 the County of Sangamon and State aforesaid, or as soon thereafter during the said
 term as counsel can be heard, I will move said Court for and on behalf of the said Peo-
 ple of the State of Illinois, for judgment upon the said bond, against each and all of the
 said defendants for the sum of two hundred & seventy five $\frac{25}{100}$ dollars,
 the amount of public revenue so due and unpaid, as aforesaid, with ten per cent per
 month interest thereon from the said first Monday of March, in the year 18 un-
 til judgment.

when and where the said defendants are hereby notified to appear and show cause, if any
 they have, why such judgment should not be rendered.
