Plaintiffs by Watts & Bernor their Attorneys complaint
of said defendant. For that whereas said defendant
heretofore comit on the 30th day of July in the

Page 3 year of Our Lord 1866 was indebted to said plaintiffs
at and in the county of Washington aforesaid in the
sum of Nine hundred dollars for divers goods wares
Merchandise & Brick by the said Plaintiffs before that
time at the special instance and request of said de-
fendant sold and delivered to him. And being so indebted
the said defendant afterward towit on the day and year
aforesaid at and in the County aforesaid undertook and
then and there promised said Plaintiffs to pay them said
sum of Nine hundred dollars when he should be

and there faithfully promised said Plaintiff to pay

paye of them for said goods wares merchandise and brick no
much money as the said goods wares merchandise and
brick were reasonably worth at the time of the sale and
delivery thereof when he said defendant should be
thereunto afterward requested, And said Plaintiffs aver
that said last mentioned goods wares merchandise
and brick were at the time of the sale and delivery
thereof reasonably worth the sum of Nine hundred
dollars of all which said defendant had notice to wit
on the day and year and at and in the county aforesaid.

Nevertheless said defendant not regarding
his said several promises and undertakings hath not
as yet paid said several sums of money or any or
either of them or any part thereof to said plaintiffs, although
often requested so to do, but to do this hath hitherto
wholly neglected and refused and still neglects and refuses
