of this term comes the Plaintiff in this suit and
continues this suit to the next term hereof, and the
defendant also comes by Selby & Sanford his Attorneys
and consents thereto. Ordered that this cause
stand continued at the costs of the Plaintiff
to be taxed.

Term A.D. 1858, the said Court the following among
other proceedings were made to wit

Replevin of a Span of Horses

This suit was continued
from the last Term of this Court and now writ on
the first day of the term comes the said Plaintiff
in person and by his Attorneys Messrs Reading & Hopkins
as well as the said Defendant by his Attorneys
Messrs Selby & Sanford. And the said Defendant
thereupon files his said Plea in this matter and
the said Plaintiff having filed his Replication
thereto and the issue being joined and submitted

to the Court with a Jury and afterwards tried
on the second day of the Term this case came on
for trial and the following jurors were duly
accepted and sworn to wit B B Hull John Barr
James Parker Theodore Daniels Louis Darrows Nathaniel
McBride William J Green Wells J Stevens Lewis J
Joseph Scott Pardee Sumnerrd Goddard and
Charles O Hale who having heard the evidence
in the case and heard the argument in the
case and having retired to consider of their
verdict returned a verdict for the Plaintiff
assessing the damage at six cents whereupon
it is considered by the court that the Plaintiff
have and receive judgment against the said
defendant for the aforesaid sum of six cents
together with his costs of suit to be taxed and
that he have execution therefor and that the
possession of the property Replevined be confirmed
to the said Plaintiff

Whereupon the said defendant gave an appeal
to the supreme court and offers as security
Joseph S Dow whereupon it is ordered by the
Court that the appeal be granted upon the
execution and filing of an appeal Bond in
the penal sum of One hundred Dollars with
the said Joseph S Dow as surety and that
he have Thirty days to consummate the same

And thereupon the said Defendant appeared
and submitted to the Court his bill of Exceptions
which were concurred in by the said Plaintiff
and approved by the Court

And afterwards to wit on the 24th day of June
the said Defendant filed with the clerk of
this Court his said appeal Bond in conformity
with the said order of Court
