Now on the third day of the term comes the plaintiff by his
atty George Abbott and also comes the defendant by Norman
& Morrison, and the parties being ready for trial, by order of
Court a Jury is called to wit: George Fulto, Henry Pritzel
Hermann Borneman, William Brooke, George Lorenz, George
L Ditch, Sidion Moge, Bartholomew Duff, Jacob Rubenack
Peter Threlfal, David Mc Lewis & Mathew Holan, twelve good
& lawful men who after being duly sworn, and heard the evidence
produced in this cause retired to deliberate on their verdict and
after deliberation, returned the following ^(which verdict is by consent of the parties occurred) Majority verdict,
to wit: That the Jury find for the plaintiff \$105. 60. of which
said sum the plaintiff remits five Dollars & fifty cts, whereupon
the defendant by his attys makes a motion for a new trial }
(Thursday 24)

Now again comes the deft by Norman & Morrison
and argues his motion for a new trial, which motion is by the
Court overruled, to which motion the deft takes exception and
prays for an appeal of this cause to the Supreme Court which is
allowed by the Court upon said defendant entering into bond,
in the penal sum of \$200, with C. L. Kettler or John
Morrison his security, within thirty days from this date condition
as the law directs. Bill of exception to be tendered
and filed in vacation

(Copy of Appeal Bond)

Know all men by these presents, That we Anton Van Dreveldt and John Morrison are held and firmly bound unto Richard Hanna in the penal sum of Two hundred Dollars lawful money of the United States for the payment of which well and truly to be made we bind our selves our heirs and administrators jointly severally and firmly by these presents. Witness our hands and seals this the twenty first day of May A.D. 1856

The Condition of the above obligation is such that whereas The said Richard Hanna did on the 3rd day of the April Term of the Circuit Court, begun and held within and for the County of Monroe in the State of Illinois on the 21st day of April A.D. 1856 recover a Judgment against the above bonded Anton Van Dreveldt for the sum of one hundred Dollars (and costs of suit) from which Judgment the said Anton Van Dreveldt has taken an appeal to the supreme Court of the said State of Illinois. Now if the said Anton Van Dreveldt shall duly prosecute this appeal, and shall well and truly pay the said Judgment together with the cost, interest and damages according to Law, in case said Judgment shall be affirmed or shall pay whatever Judgment shall be entered against him in this behalf then the above obligation to be void, otherwise To remain in full force and effect
