Reeves Sheriff and Merrill C. Young Clerk

Now comes as well the plaintiff by his attorney Roberts & Ireland as the defendants by his attorney Petteyman Bailey & Mans, where upon came a Jury of Twelve good and lawful men to wit, John Purviance, W^m Holland, Isaac E. Leonard, Seth Wilson, S. S. Porter, Aquilla Davis

Olney Williamson - George W. Emery, Jr.
A. Callender - J. W. Pratt & Cone - and
D. F. Lowrey, duly elected, tried & sworn, who
having heard the proofs and allegations of
the parties and the argument of Counsel
thereon for verdict say, We the Jury find
for the Plaintiff in the sum of Twenty
five dollars (\$25.) damages, whereupon
the defendant moved the Court for a new
trial which motion the Court overruled.


It is therefore ordered and adjudged
by the Court, that the plaintiff recover
of said defendant, the damages aforesaid
and likewise the costs and charges by him
about his suit expended, and that execution
issue therefor, whereupon the defendant
prayed an appeal.


And afterwards to wit: on the
20th day of September ad 1859, an appeal
Bond, was filed in said cause in the
words, and figures following: to wit:

Know all men by these presents
that we Peter Rice as principal and Samuel
Kimes as security are held and firmly
bound unto Charles Jordan our
the penal sum of One hundred Dollars
lawful money of the United States and
well and truly to pay which we do hereby
bind ourselves our heirs and assigns

firmly by these Presents, signed with
our hands and sealed with our seals at
Pekin this 20th day of September 1859

Now the conditions of this obligation
is such that whereas the said Charles
Gouldenbury received a Judgment in
the Federal Circuit Court at the September
term thereof A.D. 1859 against the said Peter
Rue, has prayed an appeal to the Supreme
Court, Now should the said Peter Rue
prosecute his said appeal with effect and
without delay and pay whatever Judgment
may be rendered against him on a trial or
dismissal of said appeal, then this Bond to
be null and void otherwise to remain in full
force and effect
