consist of Edmund Pennington & Taylor his attorneys and
prop an appeal herein to the Supreme Court
of this State, which is granted upon condition
that defendant within thirty days from this date
give a bond payable to the plaintiff in the penal
sum of three hundred dollars with Frederick
S. Day as his security.

And I further certify that on the 3rd day of July 1854
the defendant filed his appeal bond as was directed
by said Circuit Court
