Declaration—Same *vs.* Same. Common counts for board, meat, and drink; money had and received; work and labor; goods sold and delivered, &c. Damages \$600. Copy of Letters of Administration to Margaret Merkel, &c. Filed Oct. 20, 1855.

Plea—General issue; conclusion to country, and *similiter*. Filed Nov. 20, 1855.

Verdict \$236.25.
