Vandalia Missouri July 24. 1830.

The following is a Copy of a Receipt (or letter) Directed to James Duncan Esq  
Clerk of the Supreme Court. Vandalia, Mo.

The President & Directors of the State Bank } In Arrear upon Promiss  
James Turney } \$ Damages Ten thousand Dollars.

The Clerk of the Supreme Court with Pleas filed in this Case to Green County  
Nov. 31. 1829. (signed) George Loquor. Attorney General.

The above contains a true Copy of the Paper handed to me as the Deputy of  
James M Duncan Clerk of the Supreme Court of the State of Missouri, and which  
was handed to me and filed in the office of the Supreme Court, on the 25th day  
of November 1829. And on the same day, a summons was issued against said  
Turney directed to the Sheriff of Green County: Upon which is the following  
return. To wit: "This summons came to hands on the 30th day of November, which  
was not in time to be executed. Carrollton December 3<sup>d</sup> 1829. (signed)

Jacob Fry. Sheriff Green County.

And at a Supreme Court continued and held in Vandalia on the 9th day of  
December 1829. "J. Reynolds and J. Reese, appeared for the Defendant  
and waived service of process, and by, and with the Consent of the parties  
It is ordered that this Cause be continued until the next term of this Court."  
And at a Supreme Court continued and held in Vandalia on the 13th day

of December 1829.

"At this day, came Mr. Forquer, Attorney General; and moved the Court to dismiss this Cause, and for leave to withdraw the papers filed herein."

The above contains a copy of a letter or paper handed to me; and of the proceedings had in said Cause in the Supreme Court.
