

THE LATE HON. J. M. ROBINSON.

At a meeting of the members of the Bar and officers of the Supreme Court Room, on Saturday evening, December 30th, 1843, this meeting was called to order by O. H. BROWNING, Esq. and on his motion, ARCHIBALD WILLIAMS, Esq. was appointed Chairman, J. YOUNG SCAMMON, Secretary.

D. J. BAKER, Esq. addressed the meeting and offered the following Resolutions, which were unanimously adopted:

Resolved, That the members of the Bar and officers of the Supreme Court most feelingly deplore the death of the Honorable JOHN M. ROBINSON, one of the Associate Justices of the Supreme Court of this State, who departed this life since the last session of the Court; and we retain a lively remembrance of the urbanity, kindness of heart, and virtues for which he distinguished in his life, and lament his loss with a anxiety of fitting correspondent with our high estimation of his public character and private worth.

Resolved, That by the death of the Hon. JOHN M. ROBINSON, the State has lost one of its most cherished citizens, a prominent statesman and a valuable member of her Judiciary, and an honorable and distinguished member of our profession.

Resolved, That the chairman transmit a copy of these proceedings to the bereaved family of the deceased, as a testimonial of the esteem in which the character and virtues of Mr. Justice ROBINSON, were held by the Bar and officers of this Court, and of their sympathy in the loss sustained by them, the Court, and the State in his death.

Resolved, That the Chairman of this meeting, behalf of the Bar, and officers of this Court, move the Court that these Resolutions be entered on the minutes of the Court.
